SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Removes] Extends sunset date on temporary law [and makes permanent law] authorizing Oregon Youth Authority and county juvenile departments to disclose and provide copies of reports and other materials relating to child, ward, youth or youth offender's history and prognosis to Department of Corrections for purpose of exercising custody or supervising person committed to department's legal and physical custody.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to disclosure of certain juvenile records to Department of Corrections; creating new provisions; amending section 3, chapter 509, Oregon Laws 2015; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Section 3, chapter 509, Oregon Laws 2015, is amended to read:

Sec. 3. The amendments to ORS 419A.257 by section 2 [of this 2015 Act], chapter 509, Oregon Laws 2015, become operative on [June 30, 2017] January 1, 2020.

SECTION 2. If this 2017 Act does not become effective until after June 30, 2017, the amendment of section 3, chapter 509, Oregon Laws 2015, by section 1 of this 2017 Act revives section 1, chapter 509, Oregon Laws 2015. If this 2017 Act does not become effective until after June 30, 2017, section 1 of this 2017 Act shall be operative retroactively to that date, and the operation and effect of section 1, chapter 509, Oregon Laws 2015, shall continue unaffected from June 30, 2017, to the effective date of this 2017 Act and thereafter. Any otherwise lawful action taken or otherwise lawful obligation incurred under the authority of section 1, chapter 509, Oregon Laws 2015, after June 30, 2017, and before the effective date of this 2017 Act, is ratified and approved.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect on its passage.
