

House Bill 2287

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Pre-session filed (at the request of Governor Kate Brown for Department of Transportation)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Clarifies that registration period for vehicles initially registered on February 29 for four years will expire on last day of February four years later.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to transportation; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 803.400.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 803.400 is amended to read:

5 803.400. This section establishes and distinguishes registration periods. Each registration period
6 determines the period of validity for vehicle registration. Registration under the following registra-
7 tion periods is valid during the described registration period:

8 (1)(a) Annual registration is valid for a one-year period. Except as provided in this subsection,
9 the period starts on the first day of a calendar month and runs through the last day of the same
10 calendar month one year later. Once a vehicle is registered under annual registration, the regis-
11 tration period of the vehicle begins and ends with that same calendar month each time the vehicle
12 is reregistered or registration for the vehicle is renewed.

13 (b) Annual registration issued under ORS 803.415 (11) starts on the day a vehicle is registered
14 and runs through the same day one year later. Once a vehicle is registered annually under ORS
15 803.415 (11), the registration period of the vehicle begins and ends with that same day each time the
16 vehicle is reregistered or registration for the vehicle is renewed. Vehicles initially registered on
17 February 29 will expire on the last day of February at the end of the registration period.

18 (2) Biennial registration is valid for a two-year period. The period starts on the day a vehicle
19 is registered and runs through the same day two years later. Once a vehicle is registered under
20 biennial registration, the registration period of the vehicle begins and ends with that same day each
21 time the vehicle is reregistered or registration for the vehicle is renewed. Vehicles initially regis-
22 tered on February 29 will expire on the last day of February two years later.

23 (3) Calendar-year registration starts on January 1 of a year and runs through December 31 of
24 the same year.

25 (4) Ownership registration starts on the day the vehicle is registered and is valid until the
26 ownership of the vehicle changes.

27 (5) Permanent registration starts on the day the vehicle is registered and is valid for the life
28 of the vehicle.

29 (6) Quarterly registration starts on the first day of any calendar quarter and runs through the
30 last day of the last calendar quarter in the registration period. The number of calendar quarters in
31 a quarterly registration is elected by the vehicle owner at the time of registration. A person may

1 not establish quarterly registration periods for more than four quarters. If a vehicle is registered for
2 a quarterly registration period of less than four calendar quarters, the Department of Transportation
3 shall collect, when issuing or renewing registration of the vehicle, the additional fee for quarterly
4 registration established under ORS 803.420.

5 (7) Four-year registration starts on the day a vehicle is registered and runs through the same
6 day four years later. **Vehicles initially registered on February 29 will expire on the last day**
7 **of February four years later.**

8 **SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 803.400 by section 1 of this 2017 Act apply to vehi-**
9 **cles registered before, on or after the effective date of this 2017 Act.**
