HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2317

1	On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 30 and delete page 2 and insert:
2	"SECTION 1. ORS 692.300 is amended to read:
3	"692.300. (1) There is created the State Mortuary and Cemetery Board to carry out the purposes
4	and enforce the provisions of this chapter. The board consists of 11 members appointed by the
5	Governor and subject to confirmation by the Senate in the manner provided in ORS 171.562 and
6	171.565. All members of the board must be residents of this state. Of the members of the board:
7	"(a) [Two members] One member must be [licensed funeral service practitioners. One of the
8	members under this paragraph must be a funeral service practitioner who does not offer embalming.
9	a funeral service practitioner.
10	"(b) One member must be a representative of an immediate disposition company.
11	"(c) One member must be a representative of a licensed funeral establishment.
12	"[(b) One member must be a licensed embalmer.]
13	" $[(c)]$ (d) Three members must be representatives of cemeteries, one representing a for-profit
14	[cemeteries] cemetery, one representing a nonprofit cemetery and one representing a [city or
15	county owned or operated cemetery and one representing a special district owned or operated
16	cemetery.] cemetery owned or operated by a city, county or special district.
17	" $[(d)]$ (e) One member must be a representative of a crematorium[.] or other facility for final
18	disposition of human remains under ORS 692.275 that is not a cemetery.
19	"[(e)] (f) Four members must be representatives of the public, one of whom must be a member
20	of a recognized senior citizen organization.
21	"[(2)(a) Board members required to be licensed funeral service practitioners or licensed embalmers
22	may be selected by the Governor from a list of three to five nominees for each vacancy, submitted by:
23	"[(A) Any professional organization representing funeral service practitioners, if the vacancy on the
24	board is for a funeral service practitioner position; or]
25	"[(B) Any professional organization representing embalmers, if the vacancy on the board is for an
26	embalmer position.]
27	"(2)(a) For each vacancy on the board under subsection (1)(a) to (e) of this section, the
28	Governor may select a board member from a list of three to five nominees submitted by
29	professional organizations that represent individuals licensed, certified or registered by the
30	board or facilities regulated by the board.
31	"(b) In selecting the members of the board, the Governor shall strive to balance the represen
32	tation on the board according to:
33	"(A) Geographic areas of this state; and
34	"(B) [Ethnic group] Ethnicity.

"(3)(a) The term of office of the members of the board shall be [three] four years [ending on

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- December 31], but a member serves at the pleasure of the Governor. The terms must be staggered so that no more than four terms end each year. Except as provided in paragraph (c) of this subsection, a member is eligible for no more than two consecutive terms. If there is a vacancy for any cause, the Governor shall make an appointment to become immediately effective [for the unexpired term] to fill the vacancy. The four-year term of a board member appointed to a vacant position begins on the date of appointment.
- "(b) A board member shall be removed immediately from the board if, during the member's term, the member:
 - "(A) Is not a resident of this state;

- "(B) Has been absent from three consecutive board meetings, unless at least one absence is excused;
- "(C) Is not a licensed funeral service practitioner or a retired funeral service practitioner whose license was in good standing at the time of retirement, if the board member was appointed to serve on the board as a funeral service practitioner; or
- "(D) Is not [a licensed embalmer or a retired embalmer whose license was in good standing at the time of retirement, if the board member was appointed to serve on the board as an embalmer] an authorized representative of a cemetery, crematorium, funeral establishment or immediate disposition company, or other facility that is regulated by and in good standing with the board if the board member was appointed to serve on the board as a representative of the facility.
- "(c) A member who is a representative of the public may serve more than two consecutive terms if no other member of the public applies to fill an open position.
- "SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 692.300 by section 1 of this 2017 Act apply to individuals serving as members of the State Mortuary and Cemetery Board on the effective date of this 2017 Act.".

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
