## House Bill 2317

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of Governor Kate Brown for State Mortuary and Cemetery Board)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Increases term of member of State Mortuary and Cemetery Board from three years to four years. Removes requirement that seven board members hold specific professional licenses and requires that those members are individuals licensed, certified or registered by board.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to health professional regulatory boards; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 692.300.

## Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

**SECTION 1.** ORS 692.300 is amended to read:

- 692.300. (1) There is created the State Mortuary and Cemetery Board to carry out the purposes and enforce the provisions of this chapter. The board consists of 11 members appointed by the Governor and subject to confirmation by the Senate in the manner provided in ORS 171.562 and 171.565. All members of the board must be residents of this state. Of the members of the board:
- (a) [Two] **Seven** members must be [licensed funeral service practitioners. One of the members under this paragraph must be a funeral service practitioner who does not offer embalming.]
  - [(b) One member must be a licensed embalmer.]
  - [(c) Three members must be representatives of cemeteries, one representing for-profit cemeteries, one representing a city or county owned or operated cemetery and one representing a special district owned or operated cemetery.]
  - [(d) One member must be a representative of a crematorium.] individuals who are licensed, certified or registered by the board.
  - [(e)] (b) Four members must be representatives of the public, one of whom must be a member of a recognized senior citizen organization.
  - (2)(a) Board members required to be licensed [funeral service practitioners or licensed embalmers], certified or registered by the board may be selected by the Governor from a list of three to five nominees for each vacancy, submitted by[:]
  - [(A) Any professional organization representing funeral service practitioners, if the vacancy on the board is for a funeral service practitioner position; or]
  - [(B) Any professional organization representing embalmers, if the vacancy on the board is for an embalmer position] professional organizations representing professions or trades regulated by the board.
  - (b) In selecting the members of the board, the Governor shall strive to balance the representation on the board according to:
    - (A) Geographic areas of this state; and

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- (B) [Ethnic group] Ethnicity.
- (3)(a) The term of office of the members of the board shall be [three] four years [ending on December 31], but a member serves at the pleasure of the Governor. The terms must be staggered so that no more than four terms end each year. Except as provided in paragraph (c) of this subsection, a member is eligible for no more than two consecutive terms. If there is a vacancy for any cause, the Governor shall make an appointment to become immediately effective [for the unexpired term] to fill the vacancy. The four-year term of a board member appointed to a vacant position begins on the date of appointment.
- (b) A board member shall be removed immediately from the board if, during the member's term, the member:
  - (A) Is not a resident of this state;
- (B) Has been absent from three consecutive board meetings, unless at least one absence is excused; or
- (C) Is not [a licensed funeral service practitioner or a retired funeral service practitioner] an individual licensed, certified or registered by the board, or an individual licensed, certified or registered by the board whose license, certificate or registration was in good standing at the time of retirement, if the board member was appointed to serve on the board as [a funeral service practitioner] an individual licensed, certified or registered by the board[; or]
- [(D) Is not a licensed embalmer or a retired embalmer whose license was in good standing at the time of retirement, if the board member was appointed to serve on the board as an embalmer].
- (c) A member who is a representative of the public may serve more than two consecutive terms if no other member of the public applies to fill an open position.
- SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 692.300 by section 1 of this 2017 Act apply to individuals serving as members of the State Mortuary and Cemetery Board on the effective date of this 2017 Act.
