## House Bill 2381

Sponsored by Representative BARRETO, Senators HANSELL, WINTERS; Representatives ESQUIVEL, KENNEMER, NEARMAN (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes that violation of ethics law occurs if public official uses public resources, like electronic mail systems or office equipment, to engage in campaign activity.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the use of public resources for campaign purposes.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2017 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 244.

5 **SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section:** 

- 6 (a) "Campaign activity" means:
- 7 (A) An invitation to a political fundraiser;
- 8 (B) The solicitation of a contribution; or
- 9 (C) The promotion or opposition of any political committee or the promotion or oppo-
- sition of the nomination or election of a candidate, the gathering of signatures on an initiative, referendum or recall petition, the adoption of a measure or the recall of a public office holder.
- 13 (b) "Candidate" has the meaning given that term in ORS 260.005.

14 (c) "Contribution" has the meaning given that term in ORS 260.005.

- 15 (d) "Initiative petition" has the meaning given that term in ORS 260.005.
- 16 (e) "Measure" has the meaning given that term in ORS 260.005.
- 17 (f) "Political committee" has the meaning given that term in ORS 260.005.
- (g) "Public resources" means any item purchased with public moneys for the purpose of
  performing public work, including but not limited to computers, electronic mail systems,
  telephones and office equipment.
- 21 (h) "Recall petition" has the meaning given that term in ORS 260.005.
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## (i) "Referendum petition" has the meaning given that term in ORS 260.005.

- 23 (2) A public official may not use public resources to engage in campaign activity.

(3) Subsection (2) of this section does not apply to the use of public resources by a public
 official to prepare, print or distribute an official voters' pamphlet.

(4) Nothing in this section precludes a finding that a violation of this section may also
 constitute a violation of other state statutes, including but not limited to ORS 260.432 or
 294.100.

29 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Section 2 of this 2017 Act applies to a public official's use of public resources 30 to engage in campaign activity that is made on or after the effective date of this 2017 Act.
