## House Bill 2428

Sponsored by Representative PARRISH (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Allows candidate one business day to pay fee for candidate space in voters' pamphlet if Secretary of State or county clerk determines that petition for candidate space did not contain required number of signatures of active electors.

Prohibits Secretary of State from requiring candidate to file signature petition for space in voters' pamphlet on date prior to when candidate is required to pay fee for space in voters' pamphlet.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to candidate space in voters' pamphlet; amending ORS 251.095.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 251.095 is amended to read:

5 251.095. (1) For space in the voters' pamphlet:

6 (a) Each candidate for nomination or election to the office of President or Vice President of the

7 United States shall, at the time materials are filed under ORS 251.065, pay a fee of \$3,500 to the

8 Secretary of State or may submit a petition in a form prescribed by the secretary containing the

9 signatures of 500 active electors of the state.

10 (b) Each candidate for nomination or election to the office of United States Senator or any state 11 office to be voted for in the state at large shall, at the time materials are filed under ORS 251.065, 12 pay a fee of \$3,000 to the Secretary of State or may submit a petition in a form prescribed by the 13 secretary containing the signatures of 500 active electors of the state.

(c) Each candidate for nomination or election to the office of Representative in Congress shall, at the time materials are filed under ORS 251.065, pay a fee of \$2,500 to the Secretary of State or may submit a petition in a form prescribed by the secretary containing the signatures of 300 active electors of the candidate's electoral district.

(d) Each candidate for nomination or election to the office of state Senator or state Representative shall, at the time materials are filed under ORS 251.065, pay a fee of \$750 to the Secretary of State or may submit a petition in a form prescribed by the secretary containing the signatures of 200 active electors of the candidate's electoral district.

(e) Each candidate for nomination or election to any other office shall, at the time materials are filed under ORS 251.065, pay a fee of \$600 to the Secretary of State or may submit a petition in a form prescribed by the secretary containing the signatures of 200 active electors of the candidate's electoral district.

(2)(a) The signatures on a petition submitted under subsection (1) of this section shall be verified
by the county clerk or the Secretary of State.

(b) The Secretary of State by rule shall establish procedures for verifying whether a petition
 submitted under subsection (1) of this section contains the required number of signatures of active

electors. If a candidate has timely submitted all materials required to be filed under ORS 2 251.065, but the county clerk or the Secretary of State determines that a petition submitted 3 under subsection (1) of this section does not contain the required number of signatures of 4 active electors, the candidate shall be allowed one business day to pay the fee established 5 under subsection (1) of this section.

6 (c) The Secretary of State may not require that a candidate file signatures on a petition 7 under subsection (1) of this section on a date prior to when a candidate is required to pay a 8 fee under subsection (1) of this section.

9 (3) The space allotted to each candidate shall be used for materials filed under ORS 251.065, 10 including the portrait and statement of reasons the candidate should be nominated or elected and 11 the information required under ORS 251.085. The length of the statement may not exceed 325 words. 12 All candidates shall be allowed the same amount of space. The Secretary of State by rule shall 13 prescribe the size of the space allotted to each candidate, except that the space may not be smaller 14 than 30 square inches.
