7 “(e) A person who is employed by a state, local or federal government agency or by a community
8 mental health program or drug and alcohol treatment program authorized by this state, if the person
9 provides services within the person’s scope of employment and the person does not use the term
10 ‘art therapy’ in connection with the services; or

11 “(f) A person who is authorized by this state to provide mental health services if the person
12 provides those services within the person’s authorized scope of practice and does not use the title
13 ‘art therapist’ in connection with the services.

14 **“SECTION 6. In the manner prescribed in ORS chapter 183 for contested cases, the
15 Health Licensing Office may impose a form of discipline as specified in ORS 676.612 against
16 any person practicing art therapy for any of the grounds listed in ORS 676.612 and for any
17 violation of sections 1 to 7 of this 2017 Act, or the rules adopted under sections 1 to 7 of this
18 2017 Act.”.**

22 **“676.583.** Pursuant to ORS 676.586, the Health Licensing Office shall provide administrative and

25 “(1) Board of Athletic Trainers, as provided in ORS 688.701 to 688.734;

26 “(2) Board of Cosmetology, as provided in ORS 690.005 to 690.225;

27 “(3) State Board of Denture Technology, as provided in ORS 680.500 to 680.565;

28 “(4) State Board of Direct Entry Midwifery, as provided in ORS 687.405 to 687.495;

29 “(5) Respiratory Therapist and Polysomnographic Technologist Licensing Board, as provided in
30 ORS 688.800 to 688.840;

31 “(6) Environmental Health Registration Board, as provided in ORS chapter 700;

32 “(7) Board of Electrologists and Body Art Practitioners, as provided in ORS 690.350 to 690.410;

5 **“SECTION 9.** ORS 676.610 is amended to read:

6 “676.610. (1)(a) The Health Licensing Office is under the supervision and control of a director,
7 who is responsible for the performance of the duties, functions and powers and for the organization
8 of the office.

9 “(b) The Director of the Oregon Health Authority shall establish the qualifications for and ap-
10 point the Director of the Health Licensing Office, who holds office at the pleasure of the Director
11 of the Oregon Health Authority.

12 “(c) The Director of the Health Licensing Office shall receive a salary as provided by law or,
13 if not so provided, as prescribed by the Director of the Oregon Health Authority.

14 “(d) The Director of the Health Licensing Office is in the unclassified service.

15 “(2) The Director of the Health Licensing Office shall provide the boards [and], councils **and**
16 **programs** administered by the office with such services and employees as the office requires to
17 carry out the office’s duties. Subject to any applicable provisions of the State Personnel Relations
18 Law, the Director of the Health Licensing Office shall appoint all subordinate officers and employ-
19 ees of the office, prescribe their duties and fix their compensation.

20 “(3) The Director of the Health Licensing Office is responsible for carrying out the duties,
21 functions and powers under ORS 675.360 to 675.410, 676.575 to 676.625, 676.810, 676.815, 676.825,
22 676.992, 678.710 to 678.820, 680.500 to 680.565, 687.405 to 687.495, 687.895, 688.701 to 688.734, 688.800
23 to 688.840, 690.005 to 690.225, 690.350 to 690.410, 691.405 to 691.485 and 694.015 to 694.170 and ORS
24 chapter 700 **and sections 1 to 7 of this 2017 Act.**

25 “(4) The enumeration of duties, functions and powers in subsection (3) of this section is not in-
26 tended to be exclusive or to limit the duties, functions and powers imposed on or vested in the office
27 by other statutes.

28 **“SECTION 10.** ORS 676.612 is amended to read:

29 “676.612. (1) Subject to ORS 676.616 and 687.445, and in the manner prescribed in ORS chapter
30 183 for contested cases and as specified in ORS 675.385, 676.825, 678.780, 680.535, 687.445, 688.734,
31 688.836, 690.167, 690.407, 691.477, 694.147 and 700.111 **and section 6 of this 2017 Act**, the Health
32 Licensing Office may refuse to issue or renew, may suspend or revoke or may otherwise condition
33 or limit an authorization or may discipline or place on probation an authorization holder for com-
34 mission of the prohibited acts listed in subsection (2) of this section.

35 “(2) A person subject to the authority of a board [or], council **or program** listed in ORS 676.583
36 commits a prohibited act if the person engages in:

37 “(a) Fraud, misrepresentation, concealment of material facts or deception in applying for or ob-
38 taining an authorization to practice in this state, or in any written or oral communication to the
39 office concerning the issuance or retention of the authorization.

40 “(b) Using, causing or promoting the use of any advertising matter, promotional literature, tes-
41 timonial, guarantee, warranty, label, insignia or any other representation, however disseminated or
42 published, that is false, misleading or deceptive.

43 “(c) Making a representation that the authorization holder knew or should have known is false
44 or misleading regarding skill or the efficacy or value of treatment or remedy administered by the
45 authorization holder.

1 “(d) Practicing under a false, misleading or deceptive name, or impersonating another authori-
2 zation holder.

3 “(e) Permitting a person other than the authorization holder to use the authorization.

4 “(f) Practicing with a physical or mental condition that presents an unreasonable risk of harm
5 to the authorization holder or to the person or property of others in the course of performing the
6 authorization holder’s duties.

7 “(g) Practicing while under the influence of alcohol, controlled substances or other skill-
8 impairing substances, or engaging in the illegal use of controlled substances or other skill-impairing
9 substances so as to create a risk of harm to the person or property of others in the course of per-
10 forming the duties of an authorization holder.

11 “(h) Failing to properly and reasonably accept responsibility for the actions of employees.

12 “(i) Employing, directly or indirectly, any suspended, uncertified, unlicensed or unregistered
13 person to practice a regulated occupation or profession subject to the authority of the boards
14 [*and*], councils **and programs** listed in ORS 676.583.

15 “(j) Unprofessional conduct, negligence, incompetence, repeated violations or any departure from
16 or failure to conform to standards of practice in performing services or practicing in a regulated
17 occupation or profession subject to the authority of the boards [*and*], councils **and programs** listed
18 under ORS 676.583.

19 “(k) Conviction of any criminal offense, subject to ORS 670.280. A copy of the record of con-
20 viction, certified by the clerk of the court entering the conviction, is conclusive evidence of the
21 conviction. A plea of no contest or an admission of guilt is a conviction for purposes of this para-
22 graph.

23 “(L) Failing to report any adverse action, as required by statute or rule, taken against the au-
24 thorization holder by another regulatory jurisdiction or any peer review body, health care institu-
25 tion, professional association, governmental agency, law enforcement agency or court for acts or
26 conduct similar to acts or conduct that would constitute grounds for disciplinary action as described
27 in this section.

28 “(m) Violation of a statute regulating an occupation or profession subject to the authority of the
29 boards [*and*], councils **and programs** listed in ORS 676.583.

30 “(n) Violation of any rule regulating an occupation or profession subject to the authority of the
31 boards [*and*], councils **and programs** listed in ORS 676.583.

32 “(o) Failing to cooperate with the office in any investigation, inspection or request for informa-
33 tion.

34 “(p) Selling or fraudulently obtaining or furnishing an authorization to practice in a regulated
35 occupation or profession subject to the authority of the boards [*and*], councils **and programs** listed
36 in ORS 676.583, or aiding or abetting such an act.

37 “(q) Selling or fraudulently obtaining or furnishing any record related to practice in a regulated
38 occupation or profession subject to the authority of the boards [*and*], councils **and programs** listed
39 in ORS 676.583, or aiding or abetting such an act.

40 “(r) Failing to pay an outstanding civil penalty or fee that is due or failing to meet the terms
41 of any order issued by the office that has become final.

42 “(3) For the purpose of requesting a state or nationwide criminal records check under ORS
43 181A.195, the office may require the fingerprints of a person who is:

44 “(a) Applying for an authorization;

45 “(b) Applying for renewal of an authorization; or

1 “(c) Under investigation by the office.

2 “(4) If the office places an authorization holder on probation under subsection (1) of this section,
3 the office, in consultation with the appropriate board [or], council **or program**, may determine and
4 at any time modify the conditions of the probation.

5 “(5) If an authorization is suspended, the authorization holder may not practice during the term
6 of suspension. Upon the expiration of the term of suspension, the authorization may be reinstated
7 by the office if the conditions of suspension no longer exist and the authorization holder has satis-
8 fied all requirements in the relevant statutes or administrative rules for issuance, renewal or rein-
9 statement.

10 “**SECTION 11.** ORS 676.613 is amended to read:

11 “676.613. (1) In addition to all other remedies, when it appears to the Health Licensing Office
12 that a person is engaged in, has engaged in or is about to engage in any act, practice or transaction
13 that violates any provision of ORS 675.360 to 675.410, 676.810, 676.815, 678.710 to 678.820, 680.500
14 to 680.565, 687.405 to 687.495, 688.701 to 688.734, 688.800 to 688.840, 690.005 to 690.225, 690.350 to
15 690.410, 691.405 to 691.485 or 694.015 to 694.170 or ORS chapter 700 **or sections 1 to 7 of this 2017**
16 **Act**, the office may, through the Attorney General or the district attorney of the county in which
17 the act, practice or transaction occurs or will occur, apply to the court for an injunction restraining
18 the person from the act, practice or transaction.

19 “(2) A court may issue an injunction under this section without proof of actual damages. An
20 injunction issued under this section does not relieve a person from any other prosecution or
21 enforcement action taken for violation of statutes listed in subsection (1) of this section.

23 “676.622. (1) A transaction conducted through a state or local system or network that provides
24 electronic access to the Health Licensing Office information and services is exempt from any re-
25 quirement under ORS 675.360 to 675.410, 676.575 to 676.625, 676.810, 676.815, 676.992, 680.500 to
26 680.565, 687.405 to 687.495, 688.701 to 688.734, 688.800 to 688.840, 690.005 to 690.225, 690.350 to
27 690.410, 691.405 to 691.485 and 694.015 to 694.170 and ORS chapter 700 **and sections 1 to 7 of this**
28 **2017 Act**, and rules adopted thereunder, requiring an original signature or the submission of hand-
29 written materials.

30 “(2) Electronic signatures subject to ORS 84.001 to 84.061 and facsimile signatures are accepta-
31 ble and have the same force as original signatures.

32 “**SECTION 12a.** ORS 676.185 is amended to read:

33 “676.185. As used in ORS 676.185 to 676.200:

34 “(1) ‘Direct supervisor’ means the individual who is responsible for:

35 “(a) Supervising a licensee enrolled in the impaired health professional program;

36 “(b) Monitoring the licensee’s compliance with the requirements of the program; and

37 “(c) Periodically reporting to the program on the licensee’s compliance with the requirements
38 of the program.

39 “(2) ‘Health profession licensing board’ means:

40 “(a) A health professional regulatory board as defined in ORS 676.160; or

41 “(b) The Health Licensing Office for a board [or], council **or program** listed in ORS 676.583.

42 “(3) ‘Impaired professional’ means a licensee who is unable to practice with professional skill
43 and safety by reason of habitual or excessive use or abuse of drugs, alcohol or other substances that
44 impair ability or by reason of a mental health disorder.

45 “(4) ‘Licensee’ means a health professional licensed or certified by or registered with a health

1 profession licensing board.

2 “(5) ‘Substantial noncompliance’ includes the following:

3 “(a) Criminal behavior;

4 “(b) Conduct that causes injury, death or harm to the public, or a patient, including sexual
5 impropriety with a patient;

6 “(c) Impairment in a health care setting in the course of employment;

7 “(d) A positive toxicology test result as determined by federal regulations pertaining to drug
8 testing;

9 “(e) Violation of a restriction on a licensee’s practice imposed by the impaired health profes-
10 sional program established under ORS 676.190 or the licensee’s health profession licensing board;

11 “(f) Civil commitment for mental illness;

12 “(g) Failure to participate in the program after entering into a diversion agreement under ORS
13 676.190; or

14 “(h) Failure to enroll in the program after being referred to the program.

15 “**SECTION 12b.** ORS 676.580 is amended to read:

16 “676.580. As used in ORS 676.575 to 676.625:

17 “(1) ‘Active authorization’ means an authorization that is current and not suspended.

18 “(2) ‘Authorization’ means a certificate, license, permit or registration issued by the Health Li-
19 censing Office that allows a person to practice:

20 “(a) One of the occupations or professions or maintain a facility subject to the authority of the
21 boards [*and*], councils **and programs** listed in ORS 676.583; or

22 “(b) A profession or occupation subject to direct oversight by the office.

23 “(3) ‘Expired authorization’ means an authorization that has been not current for more than
24 three years.

25 “(4) ‘Inactive authorization’ means an authorization that has been not current for three years
26 or less.

27 “**SECTION 12c.** ORS 676.586 is amended to read:

28 “676.586. (1) The Health Licensing Office is responsible for the administration and regulatory
29 oversight of the boards [*and*], councils **and programs** listed in ORS 676.583. The responsibilities of
30 the office include, but are not limited to:

31 “(a) Budgeting;

32 “(b) Record keeping;

33 “(c) Staffing;

34 “(d) Contracting;

35 “(e) Consumer protection and investigating complaints;

36 “(f) Establishing and collecting fees;

37 “(g) Establishing and administering uniform application processes for the issuance of authori-
38 zations;

39 “(h) Issuing and renewing authorizations;

40 “(i) Subject to ORS 676.616 and 687.445, conditioning, limiting, suspending, revoking or refusing
41 to issue or renew an authorization or otherwise disciplining applicants and authorization holders;

42 “(j) Sanctioning any examination service provider, interpreter or proctor who is under contract
43 or agreement with the office and who compromises the security, confidentiality or integrity of ex-
44 aminations developed or conducted pursuant to the statutory authority of the boards [*and*], councils

5 “(L) Preparing, tracking and reporting office performance measures;

6 “(m) Implementing regulatory streamlining initiatives to reduce regulatory burdens without
7 compromising regulatory standards;

8 “(n) Preparing and circulating printed and electronic materials for educating or otherwise as-
9 sisting applicants, authorization holders and the public;

10 “(o) Adopting rules for the issuance of waivers or provisional authorizations to practice, and
11 establishing special conditions of practice, during a state of emergency declared by the Governor
12 under ORS 401.165;

13 “(p) Referring impaired practitioners to a diversion program approved or recognized by the of-
14 fice and establishing criteria by rule for monitoring the impaired practitioner’s progress and suc-
15 cessful completion of the program;

16 “(q) Establishing requirements for additional education, training or supervised experience to
17 achieve compliance with the laws and rules governing professional practice;

18 “(r) Establishing by rule continuing education requirements for renewal of an authorization if
19 the office determines that continuing education is appropriate for renewal of the authorization;

20 “(s) Exempting from authorization requirements a person who provides services at charitable
21 or fund raising events, after the office has considered and evaluated the written request for an ex-
22 emption on an individual basis; and

23 “(t) Establishing requirements by rule for the issuance of a provisional authorization for pur-
24 poses related to education or training.

25 “(2) The enumeration of duties, functions and powers in subsection (1) of this section is not in-
26 tended to be exclusive or to limit the duties, functions and powers imposed on or vested in the office
27 by other statutes.

28 “**SECTION 12d.** ORS 676.608 is amended to read:

29 “676.608. (1) As used in this section, ‘public entity’ has the meaning given that term in ORS
30 676.177.

31 “(2)(a) The Health Licensing Office shall carry out the investigatory duties necessary to enforce
32 the provisions of ORS 676.575 to 676.625 and 676.992.

33 “(b) Subject to subsection (12) of this section, the office, upon its own motion, may initiate and
34 conduct investigations of matters relating to the practice of occupations or professions subject to
35 the authority of the boards [*and*], councils **and programs** listed in ORS 676.583.

36 “(c) Subject to subsection (12) of this section, when the office receives a complaint against an
37 authorization holder, the office shall investigate the complaint as provided in ORS 676.165.

38 “(3) While conducting an investigation authorized under subsection (2) of this section or a
39 hearing related to an investigation, the office may:

40 “(a) Take evidence;

41 “(b) Administer oaths;

42 “(c) Take the depositions of witnesses, including the person charged;

43 “(d) Compel the appearance of witnesses, including the person charged;

44 “(e) Require answers to interrogatories;

45 “(f) Compel the production of books, papers, accounts, documents and testimony pertaining to

1 the matter under investigation; and

2 “(g) Conduct criminal and civil background checks to determine conviction of a crime that bears
3 a demonstrable relationship to the field of practice.

4 “(4) In exercising its authority under this section, the office may issue subpoenas over the sig-
5 nature of the Director of the Health Licensing Office or designated employee of the director and in
6 the name of the State of Oregon.

7 “(5) If a person fails to comply with a subpoena issued under this section, the judge of the Cir-
8 cuit Court for Marion County may compel obedience by initiating proceedings for contempt as in
9 the case of disobedience of the requirements of a subpoena issued from the court.

10 “(6) If necessary, the director, or an employee designated by the director, may appear before a
11 magistrate empowered to issue warrants in criminal cases to request that the magistrate issue a
12 warrant. The magistrate shall issue a warrant, directing it to any sheriff or deputy or police officer,
13 to enter the described property, to remove any person or obstacle, to defend any threatened violence
14 to the director or a designee of the director or an officer, upon entering private property, or to as-
15 sist the director in enforcing the office’s authority in any way.

16 “(7) In all investigations and hearings, the office and any person affected by the investigation
17 or hearing may have the benefit of counsel.

18 “(8) If an authorization holder who is the subject of a complaint or an investigation is to appear
19 before the office, the office shall provide the authorization holder with a current summary of the
20 complaint or the matter being investigated not less than 10 days before the date that the authori-
21 zation holder is to appear. At the time the summary of the complaint or the matter being investi-
22 gated is provided, the office shall provide the authorization holder with a current summary of
23 documents or alleged facts that the office has acquired as a result of the investigation. The name
24 of the complainant may be withheld from the authorization holder.

25 “(9) An authorization holder who is the subject of an investigation, and any person acting on
26 behalf of the authorization holder, may not contact the complainant until the authorization holder
27 has requested a contested case hearing and the office has authorized the taking of the complainant’s
28 deposition pursuant to ORS 183.425.

29 “(10) Except in an investigation or proceeding conducted by the office or another public entity,
30 or in an action, suit or proceeding in which a public entity is a party, an authorization holder may
31 not be questioned or examined regarding any communication with the office made in an appearance
32 before the office as part of an investigation.

33 “(11) This section does not prohibit examination or questioning of an authorization holder re-
34 garding records about the authorization holder’s care and treatment of a patient or affect the
35 admissibility of those records.

36 “(12) In conducting an investigation related to the practice of direct entry midwifery, as defined
37 in ORS 687.405, the office shall:

38 “(a) Allow the State Board of Direct Entry Midwifery to review the motion or complaint before
39 beginning the investigation;

40 “(b) Allow the board to prioritize the investigation with respect to other investigations related
41 to the practice of direct entry midwifery; and

42 “(c) Consult with the board during and after the investigation for the purpose of determining
43 whether to pursue disciplinary action.

44 “**SECTION 12e.** ORS 676.615 is amended to read:

45 “676.615. (1) In accordance with applicable provisions of ORS chapter 183, the Director of the

1 Health Licensing Office may adopt rules necessary for the administration of the laws that the
2 Health Licensing Office is charged with administering.

3 “(2) In accordance with applicable provisions of ORS chapter 183, the director may adopt rules
4 necessary for the administration of ORS 676.575 to 676.625 and 676.992.

5 “(3) The office may adopt rules establishing requirements for placement of an authorization is-
6 sued by the office in a dormant status upon application by the authorization holder and establishing
7 conditions for reactivation of the authorization.

8 “(4) Pursuant to ORS 676.575 and 676.586, the office may adopt rules to recognize specialties
9 within a regulated field of practice subject to the authority of the boards [and], councils **and pro-**
10 **grams** listed in ORS 676.583 and may establish requirements for education, experience, examinations
11 and supervision as necessary to ensure public safety and competency within the specialty.

14 “676.625. (1) The Health Licensing Office shall establish by rule and shall collect fees and

16 and any responsibility imposed on the office pertaining to the boards [and], councils **and programs**
17 administered and regulated by the office pursuant to ORS 676.583.

18 “(2) The Health Licensing Office Account is established separate and distinct from the General
19 Fund. The account shall consist of the moneys credited to the account by the Legislative Assembly.
20 All moneys in the account are continuously appropriated to and shall be used by the office for
21 payment of expenses of the office in carrying out the duties, functions and obligations of the office,
22 and for payment of the expenses of the boards [and], councils **and programs** administered and
23 regulated by the office pursuant to ORS 676.583. The office shall keep a record of all moneys cred-
24 ited to the account and report the source from which the moneys are derived and the activity of
25 each board [or], council **or program** that generated the moneys.

26 “(3) Subject to prior approval of the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and a report
27 to the Emergency Board prior to establishing fees and charges credited to the account, the fees and

30 as the budget may be modified by the Emergency Board.

33 continuously appropriated to the office for carrying out the duties, functions and powers of the office

35 “(5) The moneys received from civil penalties assessed under ORS 676.992 shall be deposited and
36 accounted for as are other moneys received by the office and shall be for the administration and
37 enforcement of the statutes governing the boards [and], councils **and programs** administered by the
38 office.”.
