## House Bill 2491

Sponsored by Representative BENTZ (at the request of Cary Mathis) (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Creates offense of failure to obtain Oregon disabled person parking permit if person continues to use disabled person parking permit issued by another jurisdiction and fails to obtain Oregon parking permit after being domiciled in or resident of Oregon for 90 days or more. Punishes by maximum fine of \$250.

Creates offense of failure to surrender prior disabled person parking permit. Punishes by maximum fine of \$250.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to disabled person parking permits; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 811.612.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

**SECTION 1.** ORS 811.612 is amended to read:

811.612. [To maintain disabled person parking privileges after relocation, a person who relocates to Oregon and who holds a disabled person parking permit from another state shall obtain an Oregon disabled person parking permit pursuant to ORS 811.602.]

- (1) A person commits the offense of failure to obtain an Oregon disabled person parking permit if the person:
- (a) Is domiciled in or is a resident of this state, as those terms are described in ORS 807.062, for 90 days or more;
- (b) Parks a vehicle in a parking space reserved for persons with disabilities as described in ORS 811.615 while using a disabled person parking permit issued by another jurisdiction; and
  - (c) Fails to obtain an Oregon disabled person parking permit pursuant to ORS 811.602.
- (2) The offense described in this section, failure to obtain an Oregon disabled person parking permit, is a Class D traffic violation.
- SECTION 2. Section 3 of this 2017 Act is added to and made a part of the Oregon Vehicle Code.
- SECTION 3. (1) Except as provided in ORS 811.611 for issuance of a foreign visitor placard, a person commits the offense of failure to surrender a prior disabled person parking permit if the person accepts a disabled person parking permit issued by the Department of Transportation without first surrendering all other disabled person parking permits issued to the person by another jurisdiction.
- (2) The offense described in this section, failure to surrender a prior disabled person parking permit, is a Class D traffic violation.
