## House Bill 2509

Sponsored by Representative BARNHART (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Permits person driving electric vehicle to use high occupancy vehicle lanes regardless of number of occupants in vehicle. Makes contingent upon repeal of federal prohibition of exception.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
2	Relating to high occupancy vehicle lanes.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) A person driving a vehicle that is powered solely by electricity may drive
5	in a high occupancy vehicle lane regardless of the number of occupants in the vehicle.
6	(2) The Department of Transportation may adopt rules for the implementation and ad-
7	ministration of this section, including but not limited to rules necessary to fulfill the federal
8	certification and labeling requirements. The department may charge a fee necessary to cover
9	the costs of certifying and labeling vehicles under this section.
10	SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2017 Act becomes operative on January 2 of the even-
11	numbered year following the date that:
12	(1) The United States repeals the portion of 23 U.S.C. 166(b)(5)(A) that prohibits states
13	from providing, on and after September 30, 2017, an exception to low emission and energy
14	efficient vehicles to use the high occupancy vehicle lanes regardless of the number of occu-
15	pants; and
16	(2) The Director of Transportation notifies the Legislative Counsel of the repeal.
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
