

## HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2548

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “schools” insert “; creating new provisions; amending  
2 sections 2 and 3, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2017 (Ballot Measure 98 (2016)); and prescribing an effec-  
3 tive date”.

4 Delete lines 4 through 30 and delete page 2 and insert:

5 **“SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Education shall distribute moneys to support career  
6 and technical student organizations in providing opportunities for students in this state to  
7 develop leadership, academic and career skills.**

8 **“(2) Organizations receiving moneys as provided by this section shall be managed indi-  
9 vidually by their respective association leadership bodies in coordination with the depart-  
10 ment.**

11 **“(3) The department, on behalf of the State of Oregon, may solicit and accept gifts,  
12 grants, donations and other moneys from public and private sources for distribution to or-  
13 ganizations as described in subsection (1) of this section.**

14 **“(4) Nothing in this section prevents a school district from receiving apportionments  
15 under section 3, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2017 (Ballot Measure 98 (2016)).**

16 **“SECTION 2.** Section 2, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2017 (Ballot Measure 98 (2016)), is amended  
17 to read:

18 **“Sec. 2.** The High School Graduation and College and Career Readiness Fund is established in  
19 the General Fund for the purposes of improving the graduation rates and college and career read-  
20 iness of all high school students in Oregon. The Legislative Assembly shall appropriate, allocate or  
21 otherwise make available to the **High School Graduation and College and Career Readiness Fund**  
22 an amount not less than \$800 per high school student per school year. The fund is continuously  
23 appropriated to the Department of Education for the purposes of sections 2 to 16, [*of this 2016*  
24 *Act*] **chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2017 (Ballot Measure 98 (2016)), and for the purposes of distrib-**  
25 **utions to career and technical student organizations as described in section 1 of this 2017**  
26 **Act.**

27 **“SECTION 3.** Section 3, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2017 (Ballot Measure 98 (2016)), is amended  
28 to read:

29 **“Sec. 3. (1)(a)** Subject to sections 10 and 14, **chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2017 (Ballot Measure**  
30 **98 (2016)), and after any distributions have been made to career and technical student or-**  
31 **ganizations as described in section 1 of this 2017 Act** [*of this 2016 Act, for school years beginning*  
32 *on or after July 1, 2017*], the High School Graduation and College and Career Readiness Fund shall  
33 be apportioned to each school district based on the extended weighted average daily membership  
34 of high school students computed as provided in ORS 327.013 (1)(c) **for the purposes described in**  
35 **sections 2 to 16, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2017 (Ballot Measure 98 (2016)).**

1           “(b) In the event the Department of Education is unable to determine the extended weighted  
2 average daily membership of high school students for a school district, the department may deter-  
3 mine the average extended weighted average daily membership for all students in the school district  
4 and apply the average extended weighted average daily membership to the number of high school  
5 students in the school district.

6           “(2)(a) For school years beginning on or after July 1, 2018, the amount appropriated, allocated  
7 or otherwise made available to the fund under section 2, **chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2017 (Ballot**  
8 **Measure 98 (2016))**, [*of this 2016 Act*] shall be increased each school year in a biennium by the  
9 amount derived from the application of the process in Executive Order 14-14 used to calculate the  
10 cost to maintain the current level of service.

11           “(b) The intent of paragraph (a) of this subsection is to apply the process in Executive Order  
12 14-14 in the event Executive Order 14-14 is canceled, superseded or otherwise made ineffective.

13           “**SECTION 4. This 2017 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2017**  
14 **regular session of the Seventy-ninth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.**”.
