

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2580

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, delete “; amending ORS 414.631”.

2 Delete lines 4 through 31 and delete page 2 and insert:

3 **“SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:**

4 **“(a) ‘Coordinated care organization’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 414.025.**

5 **“(b) ‘Substitute care’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 419A.004.**

6 **“(2) The Oregon Health Authority shall enroll in a coordinated care organization a child**
7 **who is:**

8 **“(a) In the legal custody of the Department of Human Services;**

9 **“(b) Eligible for medical assistance; and**

10 **“(c) Placed, by the department, in substitute care in this state.**

11 **“(3) The authority and the department shall have procedures in place to ensure that:**

12 **“(a) A child described in subsection (2) of this section:**

13 **“(A) Is enrolled in a coordinated care organization for integrated physical, behavioral and**
14 **dental health services; and**

15 **“(B) Who is enrolled in a coordinated care organization when taken into custody or when**
16 **the child’s placement changes to another geographic area in this state, remains enrolled in**
17 **the coordinated care organization until the transition of the child’s care to another coordi-**
18 **nated care organization has been completed in accordance with paragraph (b) of this sub-**
19 **section;**

20 **“(b) The health information in the case plan, any plan for care and treatment prepared**
21 **in accordance with ORS 419B.346, medical records and care history of a child placed in sub-**
22 **stitute care are electronically transmitted without delay to the coordinated care organization**
23 **in which the child is or will be enrolled in order to ensure continuity in the child’s care; and**

24 **“(c) The child’s electronic record in the medical assistance database has a code that en-**
25 **ables a coordinated care organization to identify the child as being in substitute care so that**
26 **the child can receive the targeted services that are designed to improve the health outcomes**
27 **of children in substitute care.**

28 **“(4) The authority shall actively encourage and facilitate the provision by coordinated**
29 **care organizations to children in substitute care of the physical, behavioral and dental health**
30 **services that are in accordance with guidelines and recommendations by the American**
31 **Academy of Pediatrics to address the unique needs of children who are in substitute care.**

32 **“(5) This section does not prohibit the authority from disenrolling a child from a coordi-**
33 **nated care organization before the end of the next enrollment cycle if necessary to ensure**
34 **continuity of care or other urgent purposes by agreement of the authority and the depart-**
35 **ment.**

1 **“SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section:**
2 **“(a) ‘Coordinated care organization’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 414.025.**
3 **“(b) ‘Substitute care’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 419A.004.**
4 **“(2) The Oregon Health Authority and the Department of Human Services, in collab-**
5 **oration with coordinated care organizations, shall take steps necessary to allow greater**
6 **sharing of data regarding their shared clients, including but not limited to developing an**
7 **Internet-based universal health record database for all children in substitute care that in-**
8 **cludes demographic and clinical information maintained by substitute care providers, coor-**
9 **ordinated care organizations and the department.**
10 **“(3) No later than September 15, 2018, the authority shall report to the interim commit-**
11 **tees of the Legislative Assembly related to health care on the implementation of this section.**
12 **“SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2017 Act is repealed on January 2, 2019.”.**
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
