SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Oregon Health Authority and Department of Consumer and Business Services to create and implement educational campaign about options available to breast cancer patients for insurance coverage of breast reconstruction surgery, breast prostheses and breast forms.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to breast cancer.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Health Authority and the Department of Consumer and**
5 **Business Services shall collaborate to create and implement a campaign to educate breast**
6 **cancer patients about the availability of insurance coverage for breast reconstruction and**
7 **breast prostheses.**

8 (2) The authority and the department may create new educational materials or make
9 available materials published by for-profit or nonprofit organizations. The materials must
10 provide, at a minimum, all of the following:

11 (a) Information about the availability of breast reconstruction surgery following a
12 mastectomy including that the breast reconstruction surgery may be performed at the time
13 of a mastectomy or the breast reconstruction surgery may be delayed until a time after the
14 mastectomy.

15 (b) Information about prostheses or breast forms as alternatives to breast reconstruction
16 surgery.

17 (c) Information about the requirements of the Women's Health and Cancer Rights Act
18 of 1998 (P.L. 105-277) including the right to breast reconstruction surgery even if the surgery
19 is delayed.
