79th OREGON LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY--2017 Regular Session

House Bill 2663

Sponsored by Representative NOSSE (at the request of Kathy Duhon) (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes Task Force to study provisions of California's Knox-Keene Health Care Service Plan Act of 1975 to determine appropriateness and feasibility of adopting any provisions in Oregon. Sunsets December 31, 2018. Declares emergency effective on passage

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A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to health care; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Task Force on California's Knox-Keene Health Care Service Plan Act

5 of 1975 is established.

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6 (2) The task force consists of seven members appointed as follows:

- 7 (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint three members from among members of the
 8 Senate.
- 9 (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint four members from among
 10 members of the House of Representatives.

(3) The task force shall study the provisions of California's Knox-Keene Health Care
 Service Plan Act of 1975 to determine the appropriateness and feasibility of adopting any of

13 the provisions in this state.

- (4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction
 of business.
- (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members
 of the task force.
- 18 (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.
- (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint ment to become immediately effective.

(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson
or of a majority of the members of the task force.

23 (9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.

- (10) The task force may presession file legislation in the manner provided in ORS 171.130
 for interim committees. All legislation recommended by official action of the task force must
 indicate that it is introduced at the request of the task force.
- (11) The task force shall report to the Legislative Assembly in the manner provided in
 ORS 192.245 at any time within 30 days after its final meeting or at a time the President and
 Speaker designate.
- 30 (12) The Legislative Administrator may employ persons necessary for the performance

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1 of the functions of the task force. The Legislative Administrator shall fix the duties and

2 amounts of compensation of these employees. The task force shall use the services of con-

tinuing legislative staff, without employing additional persons, to the greatest extent practi cable.

5 (13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist

6 the task force in the performance of the duties of the task force and, to the extent permitted

7 by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish the information and advice the members of the

8 task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

9 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2017 Act is repealed on December 31, 2018.

10 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 11 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect 12 on its passage.

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
