

House Bill 2675

Sponsored by Representative NOSSE; Representatives BUEHLER, KENNEMER, KOTEK, MALSTROM, Senator MONNES ANDERSON (Pre-session filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires community health improvement plans adopted by coordinated care organizations and community advisory councils to focus on and develop strategy for integrating physical, behavioral and oral health care services.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to community health improvement plans; amending ORS 414.627.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 414.627 is amended to read:

5 414.627. (1) A coordinated care organization must have a community advisory council to ensure
6 that the health care needs of the consumers and the community are being addressed. The council
7 must:

8 (a) Include representatives of the community and of each county government served by the co-
9 ordinated care organization, but consumer representatives must constitute a majority of the mem-
10 bership; and

11 (b) Have its membership selected by a committee composed of equal numbers of county repre-
12 sentatives from each county served by the coordinated care organization and members of the gov-
13 erning body of the coordinated care organization.

14 (2) The duties of the council include, but are not limited to:

15 (a) Identifying and advocating for preventive care practices to be utilized by the coordinated
16 care organization;

17 (b) Overseeing a community health assessment and adopting a community health improvement
18 plan to serve as a strategic population health and health care system service plan for the community
19 served by the coordinated care organization; and

20 (c) Annually publishing a report on the progress of the community health improvement plan.

21 (3) The community health improvement plan adopted by the council should describe the scope
22 of the activities, services and responsibilities that the coordinated care organization will consider
23 upon implementation of the plan. The activities, services and responsibilities defined in the plan
24 **shall include a plan and a strategy for integrating physical, behavioral and oral health care**
25 **services and** may include, but are not limited to:

26 (a) Analysis and development of public and private resources, capacities and metrics based on
27 ongoing community health assessment activities and population health priorities;

28 (b) Health policy;

29 (c) System design;

30 (d) Outcome and quality improvement;

NOTE: Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

1 (e) Integration of service delivery; and

2 (f) Workforce development.

3 (4) The council shall meet at least once every three months. The council shall post a report
4 of its meetings and discussions to the website of the coordinated care organization and other
5 websites appropriate to keeping the community informed of the council's activities. The council, the
6 governing body of the coordinated care organization or a designee of the council or governing body
7 has discretion as to whether public comments received at meetings that are open to the public will
8 be included in the reports posted to the website and, if so, which comments are appropriate for
9 posting.

10 (5) If the regular council meetings are not open to the public and do not provide an opportunity
11 for members of the public to provide written and oral comments, the council shall hold quarterly
12 meetings:

13 (a) That are open to the public and attended by the members of the council;

14 (b) At which the council shall report on the activities of the coordinated care organization and
15 the council;

16 (c) At which the council shall provide written reports on the activities of the coordinated care
17 organization; and

18 (d) At which the council shall provide the opportunity for the public to provide written or oral
19 comments.

20 (6) The coordinated care organization shall post to the organization's website contact informa-
21 tion for, at a minimum, the chairperson, a member of the community advisory council or a desig-
22 nated staff member of the organization.

23 (7) Meetings of the council are not subject to ORS 192.610 to 192.690.

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
