House Bill 2751

Sponsored by Representative BARRETO

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Allows occupational therapists to participate in primary care provider loan repayment program. Extends sunset of primary care provider loan repayment program to January 2, 2020.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to health care providers; creating new provisions; amending sections 9, 11, 12 and 13, chapter 829, Oregon Laws 2015; repealing ORS 413.233; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. In adopting rules under ORS 413.233 (2)(a), the Oregon Health Authority shall include as a type of primary care provider who may participate in the primary care provider loan repayment program individuals who practice occupational therapy, as defined in ORS 675.210.
 - SECTION 2. (1) ORS 413.233 is repealed on January 2, 2020.
 - (2) Individuals participating in the primary care provider loan repayment program on January 1, 2020, shall continue to participate for the duration of the term of the individual's commitment made pursuant to ORS 413.233.
 - (3) Nothing in the repeal of ORS 413.233 relieves a person of a liability, duty or obligation accruing under or with respect to ORS 413.233. Payments made by participants to discharge an obligation arising under ORS 413.233 on or after January 2, 2020, shall be deposited in the Health Care Provider Incentive Fund established in ORS 676.450.

 - [(2) Individuals participating in the primary care provider loan repayment program on the operative date of this section shall continue to participate for the duration of the term of the individual's commitment made pursuant to ORS 413.233.]
 - [(3)] (2) Nothing in the repeal of ORS 348.303[, 413.233] and 442.574 relieves a person of a liability, duty or obligation accruing under or with respect to ORS 348.303[, 413.233] and 442.574. Payments made by participants to discharge an obligation arising under ORS 348.303 (6) or (7)[, 413.233 (2)(e)] or 442.574 shall be deposited [to] in the Health Care Provider Incentive Fund established in [section 1 of this 2015 Act] ORS 676.450.
 - [(4)] (3) The duties, rights and obligations of the Office of Rural Health under ORS 442.574 are transferred to the Oregon Health Authority.
 - [(5)] (4) Any unexpended balances of moneys in the Primary Health Care Loan Forgiveness Program Fund are transferred to the Health Care Provider Incentive Fund established under [section 1 of this 2015 Act] ORS 676.450 and shall be used by the Oregon Health Authority to carry out [section 2 of this 2015 Act] ORS 676.460 and to administer the service agreements entered into pursuant to ORS 442.574 that remain in effect under subsection (1) of this section.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect on its passage.
