

## HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2812

By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after the semicolon insert “creating new provisions; amending sec-  
2 tion 1, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2014;”.

3 Delete lines 4 through 10 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:**

5 **“(a) ‘Suicidal behavior’ means:**

6 **“(A) Self-directed, injurious behavior with an intent to die as a result of the behavior;**

7 **“(B) Nonfatal, self-directed, potentially injurious behavior with an intent to die as a re-  
8 sult of the behavior that may not result in injury; or**

9 **“(C) Thinking about, considering or planning suicide.**

10 **“(b) ‘Violence’ means aggressive behavior with the intention, or an outcome that poses  
11 a risk, of serious or lethal injury.**

12 **“(2) The Department of Education shall establish the School Safety Multidisciplinary  
13 Assessment Team System. The system shall consist of state-supported regional school safety  
14 multidisciplinary assessment teams to support school personnel in addressing situations  
15 concerning students:**

16 **“(a) Engaged in violence;**

17 **“(b) Posing a threat of violence to others; or**

18 **“(c) Exhibiting suicidal behavior.**

19 **“(3) The state-supported, regional teams shall:**

20 **“(a) Offer training to school district employees and community partners of school dis-  
21 tricts;**

22 **“(b) Support school districts in the establishment of school-based school safety multidis-  
23 ciplinary assessment teams;**

24 **“(c) Support school districts and communities in the establishment of local school safety  
25 multidisciplinary assessment teams; and**

26 **“(d) Provide ongoing consultation, training and technical assistance to school and local  
27 school safety multidisciplinary assessment teams to:**

28 **“(A) Investigate potential danger and identify circumstances and risk factors that may  
29 increase risk for potential violence or suicidal behavior;**

30 **“(B) Develop management and intervention plans in collaboration with community part-  
31 ners; and**

32 **“(C) Connect students and families to supportive resources.**

33 **“(4) The State Board of Education, in collaboration with the Oregon Health Authority and  
34 other interested stakeholders, shall adopt rules related to the system established under this  
35 section.**

1       “**SECTION 2.** Section 1, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2014, as amended by section 6, chapter 74,  
2 Oregon Laws 2016, is amended to read:

3       “**Sec. 1.** (1) The Task Force on School Safety is established, consisting of [16] **17** members as  
4 follows:

5       “(a) The Superintendent of State Police or the superintendent’s designee.

6       “(b) The Director of the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training or the director’s  
7 designee.

8       “(c) The Governor’s Public Safety Policy Advisor.

9       “(d) The Governor’s Education Policy Advisor.

10       “(e) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from among members of the Senate.

11       “(f) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one member from among members  
12 of the House of Representatives.

13       “(g) The Governor shall appoint [10] **11** members as follows:

14       “(A) A member of the Oregon State Sheriffs’ Association;

15       “(B) A member of the Oregon Association Chiefs of Police;

16       “(C) A member of the Oregon Fire Chiefs Association;

17       “(D) A member of the Oregon Education Association;

18       “(E) A member of the Oregon School Employees Association;

19       “(F) A member of the Oregon School Boards Association;

20       “(G) A member of the Oregon Association of Education Service Districts;

21       “(H) A member of the Confederation of Oregon School Administrators;

22       “(I) A member representing the Department of Education; [and]

23       “(J) A member of the Association of Oregon Community Mental Health Programs[.]; **and**

24       “**(K) A member representing the Oregon Health Authority, with a specialty in suicide**  
25 **intervention and prevention.**

26       “(2) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task force are nonvoting members  
27 of the task force and may act in an advisory capacity only.

28       “(3) The task force shall:

29       “(a)(A) Develop a request for proposals to be published by the Department of State Police for  
30 hiring a vendor to create a database of floor plans for all schools within the state, accessible to  
31 authorized users via the Internet; and

32       “(B) Make recommendations to the Department of State Police for the development of adminis-  
33 trative rules governing the database, including but not limited to:

34       “(i) Specifying the persons and agencies that may have access to the database;

35       “(ii) Identifying the persons or agencies that will maintain the database; and

36       “(iii) Regulating the manner in which database records are added or modified;

37       “(b) Examine models of existing education and training programs for law enforcement officials,  
38 other first responders and school employees in the area of school safety and incident response; and

39       “(c) Examine models for existing protocols for school safety and incident response and consider  
40 whether standardized statewide school safety and incident response protocols would be appropriate.

41       “(4) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction  
42 of business.

43       “(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting members  
44 of the task force.

45       “(6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson and one of its members

1 to serve as vice chairperson.

2 “(7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to  
3 become immediately effective.

4 “(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of  
5 a majority of the voting members of the task force.

6 “(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.

7 “(10) The task force shall submit a report concerning the floor plan database in the manner  
8 provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee  
9 of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary as appropriate no later than September 1,  
10 [2014.] **2017. A second report shall be submitted in a similar manner no later than September**  
11 **1, 2019.**

12 “(11) The Department of State Police shall provide staff support to the task force.

13 “(12) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not en-  
14 titled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other expenses  
15 incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for  
16 in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions of the task force shall be paid  
17 out of funds appropriated to the Department of State Police for purposes of the task force.

18 “(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task  
19 force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality,  
20 to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to per-  
21 form their duties.”.

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
