

# House Bill 2836

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to conduct study of effectiveness of Oregon Integrated and Coordinated Health Care Delivery System in improving health outcomes for medical assistance recipients.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to health.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall conduct a study to evaluate the ef-**  
5 **fectiveness of the Oregon Integrated and Coordinated Health Care Delivery System in im-**  
6 **proving the health outcomes experienced by medical assistance recipients. The study must**  
7 **take into account the outcome and quality measures reported by coordinated care organiza-**  
8 **tions in accordance with ORS 414.625 (2)(L), client surveys and other information available**  
9 **to the authority.**

10 **(2) No later than September 15, 2018, the authority shall report to the interim commit-**  
11 **tees of the Legislative Assembly related to health, in the manner provided in ORS 192.245,**  
12 **the results of the study described in subsection (1) of this section and recommendations, if**  
13 **any, for legislative changes to the Oregon Integrated and Coordinated Health Care Delivery**  
14 **System that are necessary to improve the health outcomes of medical assistance recipients**  
15 **in this state.**

16 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2017 Act is repealed on January 2, 2019.**
