House Bill 2836

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Requires Oregon Health Authority to conduct study of effectiveness of Oregon Integrated and Coordinated Health Care Delivery System in improving health outcomes for medical assistance recipients.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to health.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall conduct a study to evaluate the effectiveness of the Oregon Integrated and Coordinated Health Care Delivery System in improving the health outcomes experienced by medical assistance recipients. The study must take into account the outcome and quality measures reported by coordinated care organizations in accordance with ORS 414.625 (2)(L), client surveys and other information available to the authority.
 - (2) No later than September 15, 2018, the authority shall report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to health, in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, the results of the study described in subsection (1) of this section and recommendations, if any, for legislative changes to the Oregon Integrated and Coordinated Health Care Delivery System that are necessary to improve the health outcomes of medical assistance recipients in this state.
 - SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2017 Act is repealed on January 2, 2019.

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
