## B-Engrossed House Bill 2838

Ordered by the Senate June 8 Including House Amendments dated April 19 and Senate Amendments dated June 8

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to take specific steps to improve assistance provided to individuals applying for or seeking to renew medical assistance eligibility.

Requires authority to [update and furnish information monthly to coordinated care organization about members enrolled in coordinated care organization] provide to coordinated care organizations access to state databases and provide training to employees of coordinated care organizations who are responsible for updating member information in state databases.

Establishes Oregon Health Authority Assister Fund consisting of contributions from coordinated care organizations, governmental entities or nonprofit organizations and continuously appropriates moneys in fund to Oregon Health Authority to provide grants to [independent nonprofit] organizations and governmental entities for providing application and renewal assistance.

3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Sections 2 and 3 of this 2017 Act are added to and made a part of ORS
5	chapter 414.
6	SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section, "application assistance" means services provided
7	by organizations or governmental entities with staff who are trained to assist an applicant
8	for, or a recipient of, medical assistance in completing application and renewal forms and
9	complying with procedures to qualify for the medical assistance program.
10	(2) In order to facilitate the enrollment of eligible individuals in the medical assistance
11	program, the Oregon Health Authority shall:
12	(a) Provide grants, in accordance with subsection (3) of this section, to organizations or
13	governmental entities providing application assistance to ensure that there is at least one
14	individual available to provide application assistance for every 1,000 medical assistance re-
15	cipients;
16	(b) Maintain an easy and efficient procedure for coordinated care organizations to refer
17	members to the authority for assistance with applications and renewals;
18	(c) Allow coordinated care organizations to provide application assistance, to the extent
19	permitted by federal law, to their members who are seeking to renew medical assistance;
20	(d) Allow coordinated care organizations to provide application assistance, to the extent
21	permitted by federal law, to individuals who are applying for medical assistance and who re-
22	side in geographic areas served by only one coordinated care organization; and
23	(e) Ensure that effective procedures are in place to reenroll an individual who was in-

voluntarily disenrolled as a result of incarceration immediately upon the individual's dis charge from incarceration.

3 (3) Grants described in subsection (2)(a) of this section shall be paid from the Oregon
4 Health Authority Assister Fund established under section 4 of this 2017 Act. Grant recipi5 ents:

(a) Must provide objective, unbiased information to potential enrollees in the selection
 of a coordinated care organization and other health care providers.

(b) May not display information or marketing materials that advertise or promote a co ordinated care organization or any of its partners or subcontractors in or within 1,000 feet
 of the location where the grantee provides application assistance.

(4) The authority shall provide periodic on-site monitoring for compliance with the requirements of this section by application assisters and at enrollment sites and shall report to the Legislative Assembly any failure of a grantee to comply with subsection (3) of this section.

(5) This section does not prevent a local public health authority, as defined in ORS
 431.003, from providing application assistance to applicants for and recipients of medical as sistance.

(6) The authority shall request any federal approval that may be required in order to
 secure federal financial participation in the costs of complying with this section.

20 <u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall update at least monthly the infor-21 mation provided to each coordinated care organization about members enrolled in the coor-22 dinated care organization. The updated information must include but is not limited to each 23 member's:

24 (a) Address;

25 (b) Eligibility category;

26 (c) Telephone number;

27 (d) Electronic mail address;

28 (e) Date of renewal; and

29 (f) Medical assistance termination date.

(2) The authority shall provide to coordinated care organizations access to state data bases and shall provide training, as needed, to employees of coordinated care organizations
 who are responsible for updating member information in the state databases.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> The Oregon Health Authority Assister Fund is established in the State Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund. The Oregon Health Authority Assister Fund consists of voluntary contributions from coordinated care organizations, governmental entities or nonprofit organizations that do not receive grants under section 2 of this 2017 Act. Moneys in the fund are continuously appropriated to the Oregon Health Authority to provide grants under section 2 of this 2017 Act.

(5)(a) The Department of Human Services and the authority shall promptly transfer information received under this section to the Department of Consumer and Business Services, the United States Department of Health and Human Services or the Internal Revenue Service as necessary for the determination of eligibility for the health insurance exchange, premium tax credits or cost-sharing reductions.

(b) The Department of Human Services shall promptly transfer information received under this
 section to the authority for individuals who are eligible for medical assistance because they qualify
 for public assistance.

(6) The Department of Human Services and the authority shall accept from the Department of Consumer and Business Services an application and any verification that was submitted to the Department of Consumer and Business Services by an applicant or on behalf of an applicant in order for the Department of Human Services or the authority to determine the applicant's eligibility for medical assistance.
