## **A-Engrossed** House Bill 2890

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure

[Directs Oregon Military Department to submit report to interim legislative committees, no later than July 1, 2018, regarding implementation of Oregon Code of Military Justice.] Allocates \$500,000 of lottery revenue to Oregon Military Department for purposes of

providing tuition waivers for eligible post-secondary institutions to members of Oregon National Guard.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die. [Declares emergency, effective on passage.]

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3

SECTION 1. (1) There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, from the Ad-4 ministrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Oregon Military Department, the 5 amount of \$500,000.

(2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures:

8 (a) The amount of \$475,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Oregon Military Department from lottery 9 moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund for the 10 purpose of providing tuition waivers to members of the Oregon National Guard as provided 11 12in ORS 399.275.

(b) The amount of \$25,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the 13 maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Oregon Military Department from lottery 14 moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund for the 15 purpose of paying administrative costs associated with providing tuition waivers to members 16 of the Oregon National Guard as provided in ORS 399.275 from the funds allocated under 17 subsection (1) of this section. 18

(3) The department may not pay for a tuition waiver for a member of the Oregon Na-19 tional Guard from the funds allocated under subsection (1) of this section unless the member 2021has exhausted all federal tuition assistance programs available to the member.

SECTION 2. This 2017 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2017 2223regular session of the Seventy-ninth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.
