House Bill 2914

Sponsored by Representative BUEHLER

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires prospective contractors to list in bid or proposal submitted in response to solicitation for public contract five individuals or entities to which prospective contractor contributed most money in connection with ballot measure or election to public office.

Becomes operative January 1, 2018.

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Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to an identification of political contributions in responses to solicitations for public contracts; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2017 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 279A.

SECTION 2. (1) Every prospective contractor that submits a bid or proposal in response to a solicitation for a public contract shall list in the bid or proposal the names, addresses and other contact information for the five individuals or entities to which the prospective contractor has contributed the most money in connection with a ballot measure or election to a public office. The list must include the amount of money that the prospective contractor has contributed to each individual or entity.

(2) The Attorney General shall adopt model rules to implement this section.

SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2017 Act applies to a public contract that a contracting agency advertises or otherwise solicits or, if the contracting agency does not advertise or solicit the public contract, to a public contract into which the contracting agency enters on or after the operative date specified in section 4 of this 2017 Act.

SECTION 4. (1) Section 2 of this 2017 Act becomes operative January 1, 2018.

(2) The Attorney General and a contracting agency that adopts rules under ORS 279A.065 may adopt rules and take any other action before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary to enable the contracting agency, on and after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, to exercise all of the duties, functions and powers conferred on the Attorney General or the contracting agency by section 2 of this 2017 Act.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
