House Bill 2928

Sponsored by Representative RAYFIELD

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Permits person who will be 17 years old on date of primary election and 18 years old on date of general election to adopt major party affiliation and vote at primary election for candidates of major political party with which person is affiliated. Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Secretary of State for purpose of printing and

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Secretary of State for purpose of printing and counting additional ballots.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to voting at primary elections; creating new provisions; amending ORS 247.016, 253.540,

3 253.565 and 254.115; and declaring an emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 247.016 is amended to read:

6 247.016. (1) Subject to this section, an otherwise qualified person who is at least 17 years of age 7 may register to vote.

8 (2) Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section, a person who registers to vote under

9 subsection (1) of this section may not vote in an election until the person attains the age of 18 years.
10 (3) A person who registers to vote under subsection (1) of this section not later than 21

- 11 days before the date of the primary election and who will attain the age of 18 years after the 12 primary election but on or before the date of the general election may:
- 13 (a) Adopt a major political party affiliation; and

(b) Vote at the primary election for candidates of the major political party with which
 the person is affiliated.

16 [(3)] (4) If a person who registers to vote under subsection (1) of this section will be under 18 17 years of age on the date of the next election held on a date listed in ORS 171.185 or the next special 18 election, the person's voter registration information, including but not limited to the person's name 19 and any identifying information, may not be disclosed as a public record under ORS 192.410 to 192.505.

21 SECTION 2. ORS 254.115 is amended to read:

22 254.115. (1) The official primary election ballot shall be styled "Official Primary Nominating 23 Ballot for the _____ Party." and shall state:

24 (a) The name of the county for which it is intended.

25 (b) The date of the primary election.

26 (c) The names of all candidates for nomination at the primary election whose nominating pe-

27 titions or declarations of candidacy have been made and filed, and who have not died, withdrawn

28 or become disqualified.

29 (d) The names of candidates for election as precinct committeeperson.

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1 (e) The names of candidates for the party nomination for President of the United States who 2 qualified for the ballot under ORS 249.078.

3 (2) Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section, the primary election ballot may in-4 clude any city, county or nonpartisan office or the number, ballot title and financial estimates under 5 ORS 250.125 of any measure.

6 (3) The primary election ballot provided pursuant to ORS 247.016 to a person who is under 7 18 years old shall be limited to stating the information set forth in subsection (1) of this 8 section.

9 [(3)] (4) The ballot may not contain the name of any person other than those referred to in 10 subsections (1) [and (2)] to (3) of this section. The name of each candidate for whom a nominating 11 petition or declaration of candidacy has been filed shall be printed on the ballot in but one place. 12 In the event that two or more candidates for the same nomination or office have the same or similar 13 surnames, the location of their places of residence shall be printed with their names to distinguish 14 one from another.

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SECTION 3. ORS 253.540 is amended to read:

16 253.540. (1) Any military or overseas elector may secure a ballot by submitting an application 17 as specified in subsection (2) of this section to the clerk of the county of the military or overseas 18 elector's residence, or to the Secretary of State. If the application is addressed to the Secretary of 19 State, the secretary shall forward it to the appropriate county clerk.

(2) An application for a ballot by a military or overseas elector shall be made in the form of a
written request. The application shall be valid for every subsequent election until the elector otherwise notifies the clerk or is no longer an elector of the county. The application shall be signed
by the applicant and contain:

24 (a) The name and current mailing address of the applicant;

25 (b) A statement that the applicant is a citizen of the United States;

(c) A statement that the applicant will be 18 years of age or older on the date of the general
 election;

(d) A statement that for more than 20 days preceding the election the applicant's home residence
has been in this state, and giving the address of the last home residence;

(e) A statement of the facts that qualify the applicant as a military or overseas elector or as the
 spouse or a dependent of a military or overseas elector;

32 (f) A statement that the applicant is not requesting a ballot from any other state and is not 33 voting in any other manner in the election except by the requested ballot; and

(g) If the applicant desires to vote in a primary election, a designation of the applicant's political party affiliation or a statement that the applicant is not affiliated with any political party. An applicant not affiliated with any political party may request a ballot for a major political party. The applicant shall be sent the ballot for the political party that the applicant requested if that political party has provided under ORS 254.365 for a primary election that admits electors not affiliated with any political party.

44 253.565. (1) Any military or overseas elector may secure a special ballot for a primary election 45 or general election by making an application under this section if the elector believes that:

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(a) The elector will be residing, stationed or working outside the territorial limits of the United 1 States and the District of Columbia; and 2 (b) The elector will be unable to vote and return a regular ballot by normal mail delivery within 3 the period provided for regular absent electors. 4 (2) A military or overseas elector shall make the application for a special ballot in the form of 5 a written request. The elector shall submit the application before the date of the applicable election 6 to the clerk of the county of the military or overseas elector's residence or to the Secretary of State. 7 If the application is addressed to the Secretary of State, the secretary shall forward it to the ap-8 9 propriate county clerk. SECTION 5. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-39 ated to the Secretary of State, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, out of the General 40 Fund, the amount of \$_____, to be allocated to county clerks for the purpose of carrying out 41 the amendments to ORS 247.016 and 254.115 by sections 1 and 2 of this 2017 Act. 42SECTION 6. The amendments to ORS 247.016, 253.540, 253.565 and 254.115 by sections 1 43 to 4 of this 2017 Act apply to primary elections held on or after the effective date of this 2017 44 Act. 45

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- 1 <u>SECTION 7.</u> This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
- 2 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect

3 on its passage.

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
