## House Bill 2931

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Clarifies educational requirements for registration of behavior analysis interventionists.

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
2	Relating to applied behavior analysis; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 676.815.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 676.815 is amended to read:
5	676.815. The Health Licensing Office shall establish by rule criteria for the registration of be-
6	havior analysis interventionists. The criteria must include, but are not limited to, the requirement
7	that the applicant:
8	(1) Have a high school diploma [or], a General Educational Development (GED) certificate or
9	a degree from a post-secondary institution;
10	(2) Be at least 18 years of age;
11	(3) Have successfully completed a state and nationwide criminal records check that requires
12	fingerprinting;
13	(4) Have completed at least 40 hours of professional training in applied behavior analysis ap-
14	proved by the office by rule; and
15	(5) Receive ongoing training and supervision by a licensed behavior analyst, by a licensed as-
16	sistant behavior analyst or by another licensed health care professional.
17	SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 676.815 by section 1 of this 2017 Act apply to ap-
18	plications for registration as a behavior analysis interventionist received by the Health Li-
19	censing Office on or after the effective date of this 2017 Act.
