House Bill 2958

Sponsored by Representatives JOHNSON, GOMBERG (at the request of Serena Profitt)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Directs Oregon Medical Board and Oregon State Board of Nursing to adopt rules requiring practitioners to screen certain patients for pathogenic E. coli bacteria and report positive screening results to Oregon Health Authority.

Becomes operative January 1, 2018. Takes effect 91st day following adjournment sine die.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to E. coli screenings; and prescribing an effective date.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> The Oregon Medical Board shall, in consultation with the Oregon State 5 Board of Nursing, adopt rules to:

6 (1) Require physicians and physician assistants to perform a screening for pathogenic E.

coli bacteria on a patient who is under 18 years of age and who presents with four or more
 consecutive days of unexplained diarrhea; and

9 (2) Direct a physician or physician assistant to inform the Oregon Health Authority of a
 positive result from an E. coli screening described in subsection (1) of this section.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> The Oregon State Board of Nursing shall, in consultation with the Oregon
 Medical Board, adopt rules to:

13 (1) Require nurse practitioners to perform a screening for pathogenic E. coli bacteria on

a patient who is under 18 years of age and who presents with four or more consecutive days
 of unexplained diarrhea; and

(2) Direct a nurse practitioner to inform the Oregon Health Authority of a positive result
 from an E. coli screening described in subsection (1) of this section.

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SECTION 3. (1) Sections 1 and 2 of this 2017 Act become operative on January 1, 2018.

(2) The Oregon Medical Board and the Oregon State Board of Nursing may take any
action before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary
to enable the boards to exercise, on or after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of
this section, all of the duties, functions and powers conferred on the boards by sections 1
and 2 of this 2017 Act.

24 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2017 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2017 25 regular session of the Seventy-ninth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.

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
