CHAPTER

AN ACT

Relating to giving false information to a peace officer; amending ORS 162.385.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 162.385 is amended to read:

162.385. (1) A person commits the crime of giving false information to a peace officer [for issuance or service of a citation or for an arrest on a warrant] in connection with a citation or warrant if the person knowingly uses or gives a false or fictitious name, address or date of birth to any peace officer [for the purpose of] when:

(a) The [officer's] **peace officer is** issuing or serving the person a citation under authority of ORS 133.055 to 133.076 or ORS chapter 153; or

[(b) The officer's arresting the person on a warrant.]

(b) There is an outstanding warrant for the person's arrest.

(2) [A person who violates this section commits] Giving false information to a peace officer in connection with a citation or warrant is a Class A misdemeanor.
