

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2998

By COMMITTEE ON HIGHER EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after “education” insert “; and declaring an emergency”.

2 Delete lines 4 through 14 and insert:

3 **“SECTION 1. (1) Community colleges and public universities listed in ORS 352.002 shall:**

4 **“(a) Evaluate existing one-year curricula for students at a public post-secondary institu-**
5 **tion of education who plan to transfer to a different public post-secondary institution of ed-**
6 **ucation; and**

7 **“(b) Establish a foundational curriculum, or foundational curricula, for the first year of**
8 **coursework at public post-secondary institutions of education in this state.**

9 **“(2) A foundational curriculum established under subsection (1) of this section must**
10 **contain a minimum of 30 college-level academic credits.**

11 **“(3) Students at a community college who complete a foundational curriculum established**
12 **under subsection (1) of this section shall:**

13 **“(a) Be able to transfer each academic credit contained within the foundational curric-**
14 **ulum from a community college to any public university listed in ORS 352.002; and**

15 **“(b) Have each academic credit from the foundational curriculum be counted towards the**
16 **student’s degree requirements at any public university listed in ORS 352.002.**

17 **“SECTION 2. The Higher Education Coordinating Commission shall convene community**
18 **colleges and public universities listed in ORS 352.002 to ensure that at least one foundational**
19 **curriculum described in section 1 of this 2017 Act is established and available for use by**
20 **community college students by the beginning of the 2018-2019 academic year.**

21 **“SECTION 3. (1) Community colleges and public universities listed in ORS 352.002 shall**
22 **collaborate to develop a unified statewide transfer agreement, based on the foundational**
23 **curricula established under section 1 of this 2017 Act, for each major course of study. Each**
24 **unified statewide transfer agreement developed under this section must:**

25 **“(a) Enable a student to transfer from a community college to a public university listed**
26 **in ORS 352.002 without the loss of academic credit or the requirement to retake a course at**
27 **a public university that the student has successfully completed at a community college,**
28 **provided that the grade in each course that is transferred meets the degree requirements**
29 **established by the unified statewide transfer agreement;**

30 **“(b) Contain provisions that identify the optimal number of academic credits, including**
31 **credits in the major course of study, that the student should have when the student trans-**
32 **fers from a community college to a public university listed in ORS 352.002 in order for the**
33 **student to efficiently receive a bachelor’s degree;**

34 **“(c) Define the classes and completion standards for the optimal number of academic**
35 **credits identified in paragraph (b) of this subsection that may be taken at a community col-**

1 lege;

2 “(d) Except as provided in paragraph (e) of this subsection, ensure that if a student at a
3 community college has completed 90 academic credits of coursework in conformity with the
4 completion standards identified in paragraph (c) of this subsection and transfers to a public
5 university listed in ORS 352.002, the student will:

6 “(A) Receive junior status in the major course of study at the public university; and

7 “(B) Be able to receive a bachelor’s degree in the major course of study by completing
8 the additional academic credits identified in the unified statewide transfer agreement after
9 transferring, based on the total number of academic credits and standards approved by the
10 accrediting body for the public university; and

11 “(e) For unified statewide transfer agreements that in paragraph (b) of this subsection
12 identify an optimal number of academic credits to transfer other than 90, ensure that if a
13 student at a community college has completed the identified number of academic credits of
14 coursework in conformity with the completion standards identified in paragraph (c) of this
15 subsection and transfers to a public university listed in ORS 352.002, the student will:

16 “(A) Receive status at the public university, based on the number of academic credits
17 referenced in the transfer agreement, that is comparable to the status of students with the
18 same number of academic credits in the major course of study who began their post-
19 secondary studies at the public university; and

20 “(B) Be able to receive a bachelor’s degree in the major course of study by completing
21 the additional academic credits identified in the unified statewide transfer agreement after
22 transferring, based on the total number of academic credits and standards approved by the
23 accrediting body for the public university.

24 “(2) In designing unified statewide transfer agreements under subsection (1) of this sec-
25 tion, community colleges and public universities listed in ORS 352.002 shall:

26 “(a) Focus on ensuring that community college students who transfer to public univer-
27 sities to complete a bachelor’s degree are able to obtain the bachelor’s degree with a similar
28 number of academic credits to those required for students who begin their post-secondary
29 studies at a public university;

30 “(b) Seek to minimize student debt;

31 “(c) Seek to increase the rate at which community college students who transfer to
32 public universities receive bachelor’s degrees; and

33 “(d) Seek to maintain the standards of intellectual and academic rigor at community
34 colleges and public universities.

35 “(3)(a) The Higher Education Coordinating Commission shall regularly convene and con-
36 sult with community colleges and public universities listed in ORS 352.002 in order to deter-
37 mine the major courses of study for which a unified statewide transfer agreement will be
38 established.

39 “(b) Determinations made under this subsection must identify a sufficient number of
40 major courses of study to enable colleges and public universities to comply with subsection
41 (4) of this section.

42 “(c) The commission shall publicly identify the criteria used to make determinations un-
43 der this subsection, which must include, but need not be limited to, a consideration of:

44 “(A) The major courses of study with the most workforce demand; and

45 “(B) The most common major courses of study among students who transfer from a

1 community college to a public university.

2 “(4) Community colleges and public universities listed in ORS 352.002 shall establish a
3 unified statewide transfer agreement for three major courses of study per year.

4 “**SECTION 4.** Notwithstanding section 3 (4) of this 2017 Act, community colleges and
5 public universities listed in ORS 352.002 shall develop the first three unified statewide
6 transfer agreements required under section 3 of this 2017 Act under the following time
7 frame:

8 “(1) The first unified statewide transfer agreement must be established by December 1,
9 2018;

10 “(2) The second unified statewide transfer agreement must be established by April 1,
11 2019; and

12 “(3) The third unified statewide transfer agreement must be established by December 1,
13 2019.

14 “**SECTION 5.** When a student attending a community college informs the community
15 college that the student intends to pursue a bachelor’s degree by transferring to a public
16 university listed in ORS 352.002, the community college shall:

17 “(1) Provide the student with information on potential major courses of study that the
18 community college has received from the public university;

19 “(2) Provide the student with a list of existing unified statewide transfer agreements; and

20 “(3) Encourage the student to identify a potential major course of study or unified
21 statewide transfer agreement prior to the student completing 45 academic credits.

22 “**SECTION 6.** (1) The Higher Education Coordinating Commission shall regularly convene
23 representatives from community colleges and public universities listed in ORS 352.002 in or-
24 der to:

25 “(a) Facilitate the coordination and establishment of foundational curricula described in
26 section 1 of this 2017 Act; and

27 “(b) Facilitate the development, and ensure the continued alignment, of the unified
28 statewide transfer agreements described in section 3 of this 2017 Act.

29 “(2) The commission shall provide staffing for each meeting held under subsection (1) of
30 this section.

31 “(3) The commission shall seek to ensure that community colleges, public universities
32 listed in ORS 352.002 and students are informed and engaged on the current status and de-
33 velopments of foundational curricula and unified statewide transfer agreements.

34 “(4) Each community college and public university listed in ORS 352.002 shall report an-
35 nually to the commission, for each unified statewide transfer agreement established under
36 section 3 of this 2017 Act, the number of academic credits that were successfully transferred
37 in that major course of study by students who transfer from a community college to a public
38 university.

39 “(5) To the extent relevant data is available, the commission shall report annually to the
40 Legislative Assembly on whether existing unified statewide transfer agreements are meeting
41 the goals set forth in section 3 (2) of this 2017 Act.

42 “**SECTION 7.** No later than June 1, 2018, community colleges and public universities listed
43 in ORS 352.002 shall submit a joint report to the interim committees of the Legislative As-
44 sembly relating to higher education regarding best practices for advising students about:

45 “(1) Foundational curricula established under section 1 of this 2017 Act;

1 “(2) Unified statewide transfer agreements established under section 3 of this 2017 Act;
2 “(3) Methods for identifying a major course of study no later than the student’s second
3 year of post-secondary education;
4 “(4) Strategies and resources available to enhance student advising effectiveness and in-
5 crease student access to information about unified statewide transfer agreements; and
6 “(5) Academic support services, with an emphasis on assisting students enrolled in
7 courses or major courses of study with high rates of incompleton.
8 “SECTION 8. No later than February 1, 2018, the Higher Education Coordinating Com-
9 mission shall provide to the Legislative Assembly a written report that:
10 “(1) In consultation with community colleges and public universities listed in ORS 352.002,
11 defines ‘lost academic credits’ for purposes of the report;
12 “(2) States the typical number of lost academic credits by current students who transfer
13 from a community college to a public university listed in ORS 352.002;
14 “(3) Makes a recommendation on whether more than one foundational curriculum should
15 be established;
16 “(4) Makes a recommendation on whether foundational curricula established under sec-
17 tion 1 of this 2017 Act should be transferable for students who transfer from one community
18 college to a different community college or from one public university listed in ORS 352.002
19 to a different public university; and
20 “(5) Lists the initial major courses of study for which unified statewide transfer agree-
21 ments will be established under section 3 (3) of this 2017 Act.
22 “SECTION 9. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
23 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect
24 on its passage.”.
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
