A-Engrossed House Bill 3014

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Requires applicants for initial license to practice respiratory therapy [and for license by reciprocity to practice respiratory therapy] to hold credential as Registered Respiratory Therapist. Applies to applications received by Health Licensing Office on or after operative date of Act. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to respiratory therapists; creating new provisions; amending ORS 688.815; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - **SECTION 1.** ORS 688.815 is amended to read:
- 6 688.815. [(1) An applicant for a license to practice respiratory care shall:] The Health Licensing
- 7 Office may issue a license to practice respiratory care to an applicant who:
 - [(a)] (1) [Submit] Submits to the [Health Licensing] office written evidence that the applicant:
- 9 [(A)] (a) Is at least 18 years of age;
 - [(B)] (b) Has completed an approved four-year high school course of study or the equivalent as determined by the appropriate educational agency; and
 - [(C)] (c) [Has completed a respiratory care education program approved by the American Medical Association in collaboration with the Joint Review Committee for Respiratory Therapy Education or their successors or equivalent organizations, as approved by the Respiratory Therapist and Polysomnographic Technologist Licensing Board; and] Holds an active credential conferred by the National Board for Respiratory Care, or its successor organization, as a Registered Respiratory Therapist; and
 - [(b)] (2) [Pass an examination] Passes any examinations approved by the Respiratory Therapist and Polysomnographic Technologist Licensing Board, including but not limited to an examination regarding Oregon law and administrative rules related to the practice of respiratory care.
 - [(2) An applicant meets the requirements of subsection (1)(a)(C) of this section if the applicant provides the office with documentation of military training or experience that the board determines is substantially equivalent to the education required by subsection (1)(a)(C) of this section.]
 - [(3) The office may issue a license to practice respiratory care by endorsement or reciprocity to:]
 - [(a) An applicant who is currently licensed to practice respiratory care under the laws of another

equivalent to those required in this state; or]																

- [(b) An applicant holding an active credential conferred by the National Board for Respiratory Care as a Certified Respiratory Therapist (CRT) or as a Registered Respiratory Therapist (RRT), or both.]
- SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 688.815 by section 1 of this 2017 Act apply to applications received by the Health Licensing Office on or after the operative date of this 2017 Act.
- SECTION 3. (1) The amendments to ORS 688.815 by section 1 of this 2017 Act become operative on January 1, 2018.
- (2) The Health Licensing Office and the Respiratory Therapist and Polysomnographic Technologist Licensing Board may take any action before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary to enable the office and board to exercise, on or after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, all of the duties, functions and powers conferred on the office and the board by the amendments to ORS 688.815 by section 1 of this 2017 Act.
- <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect on its passage.
