

House Bill 3185

Sponsored by Representatives ALONSO LEON, HERNANDEZ; Representatives BENTZ, KENY-GUYER, SOLLMAN, VIAL, Senator GELSER

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes Task Force on Family Engagement in Education. Directs task force to submit report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to education no later than September 15, 2018. Sunsets task force on December 31, 2018.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

1
2 Relating to family engagement in education; and prescribing an effective date.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Family Engagement in Education is established for**
5 **the purpose of increasing family engagement in the education of students in kindergarten**
6 **through grade 12 and in post-secondary institutions of education.**

7 **(2) The task force consists of 13 members appointed as follows:**

8 **(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from among members of the**
9 **Senate.**

10 **(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one member from among**
11 **members of the House of Representatives.**

12 **(c) The Governor shall appoint 11 members as follows:**

13 **(A) One member who is a representative from the Department of Education;**

14 **(B) One member who is a representative from the Higher Education Coordinating Com-**
15 **mission;**

16 **(C) One member who is a representative from the Chief Education Office;**

17 **(D) One member who is a teacher of English language learners;**

18 **(E) One member who teaches or provides support at a post-secondary institution of ed-**
19 **ucation to students who are English language learners;**

20 **(F) One member who is a parent of an English language learner;**

21 **(G) One member who is a teacher of students from culturally diverse families, low-**
22 **income families or rural families;**

23 **(H) One member who is an administrator at a school with students from culturally di-**
24 **verse families, low-income families or rural families;**

25 **(I) One member who teaches or provides support at a post-secondary institution of edu-**
26 **cation to students who are from culturally diverse families, low-income families or rural**
27 **families;**

28 **(J) One member who is an administrator at a post-secondary institution of education**
29 **with students who are from culturally diverse families, low-income families or rural families;**
30 **and**

1 (K) One member who is a parent of a student from a culturally diverse family, low-
2 income family or rural family.

3 (3) To the extent practicable, the appointments made under subsection (2) of this section
4 shall reflect the geographic diversity of this state.

5 (4) The task force shall evaluate methods for increasing family engagement in education
6 for students in kindergarten through grade 12 and in post-secondary institutions of educa-
7 tion, with emphasis on students from culturally diverse families, low-income families, rural
8 families and non-English speaking families.

9 (5) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task force are nonvoting
10 members of the task force and may act in an advisory capacity only.

11 (6) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction
12 of business.

13 (7) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members
14 of the task force.

15 (8) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.

16 (9) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint-
17 ment to become immediately effective.

18 (10) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson
19 or of a majority of the members of the task force.

20 (11) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.

21 (12) The task force shall submit a report, and may include recommendations for legis-
22 lation, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to education no later
23 than September 15, 2018.

24 (13) The Department of Education shall provide staff support to the task force.

25 (14) Notwithstanding ORS 171.072, members of the task force who are members of the
26 Legislative Assembly are not entitled to mileage expenses or a per diem and serve as volun-
27 teers on the task force. Other members of the task force are not entitled to compensation
28 or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.

29 (15) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist
30 the task force in the performance of the task force's duties and, to the extent permitted by
31 laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the task
32 force consider necessary to perform their duties.

33 **SECTION 2.** Section 1 of this 2017 Act is repealed on December 31, 2018.

34 **SECTION 3.** This 2017 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2017
35 regular session of the Seventy-ninth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.

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
