## House Bill 3266

Sponsored by Representative BYNUM

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Provides that no person may use mechanical restraint, chemical restraint, prone restraint, physical restraint or seclusion on student in public education program. Allows exception for police officers in limited circumstances.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the restraint of students; amending ORS 339.288.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 339.288 is amended to read:

5 339.288. (1)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, the use of a mechan-

6 ical restraint, chemical restraint or prone restraint by any person on a student in a public educa-

7 tion program in this state is prohibited.

8 (b) A police officer as defined in ORS 181A.355 may use a mechanical restraint on a stu-9 dent in a public education program only if the restraint is necessary due to a reasonable 10 threat of imminent, serious bodily injury to the student or others and there are no less re-11 strictive alternatives that will alleviate the reasonable threat of imminent, serious bodily 12 injury to the student or others. A police officer may not use a mechanical restraint for 13 punishment or convenience.

(2) The use of physical restraint or seclusion by any person on a student in a public education
program in this state is prohibited unless used as provided in ORS 339.291.

16 (3) As used in this section:

17 (a) "Chemical restraint" means a drug or medication that is used on a student to control be-18 havior or restrict freedom of movement and that is not:

(A) Prescribed by a licensed physician or other qualified health professional acting under the
professional's scope of practice for standard treatment of the student's medical or psychiatric con dition; and

(B) Administered as prescribed by a licensed physician or other qualified health professional acting under the professional's scope of practice.

(b)(A) "Mechanical restraint" means a device used to restrict the movement of a student or the
movement or normal function of a portion of the body of a student.

26 (B) "Mechanical restraint" does not include:

27 (i) A protective or stabilizing device ordered by a licensed physician; or

(ii) A vehicle safety restraint when used as intended during the transport of a student in amoving vehicle.

30 (c) "Prone restraint" means a restraint in which a student is held face down on the floor.
