## A-Engrossed House Bill 3293

Ordered by the House April 17 Including House Amendments dated April 17

Sponsored by Representatives MCLANE, ESQUIVEL; Representatives BARRETO, HACK, POST, SMITH DB, WILSON

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Provides that school district may not deny participation in interscholastic activities by student who attends public charter school. Specifies requirements that [student must meet in order] must be met in order for student to participate in interscholastic activities, including payment to school district by public charter school on behalf of student.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to student participation in interscholastic activities; amending ORS 339.450 and 339.460; and declaring an emergency.

## Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

**SECTION 1.** ORS 339.450 is amended to read:

339.450. [No] A school, school district or association, whether public or private, [shall] may not deny any grade or high school student the right to participate in interscholastic athletics solely on the ground that the student transferred between schools, attends a public charter school or participated in athletics at another school.

**SECTION 2.** ORS 339.460 is amended to read:

339.460. [(1) Homeschooled students shall not be denied by a school district the opportunity to participate in all interscholastic activities if the student fulfills the following conditions:]

- [(a) The student must meet all school district eligibility requirements with the exception of:]
- [(A) The school district's school or class attendance requirements; and]
- 15 [(B) The class requirements of the voluntary association administering interscholastic activities.]
  - [(b)(A) The student must achieve a minimum score on an examination from the list adopted by the State Board of Education pursuant to ORS 339.035. The examination shall be taken at the end of each school year and shall be used to determine eligibility for the following year. The minimum, composite test score that a student must achieve shall place the student at or above the 23rd percentile based on national norms. The parent or legal guardian shall submit the examination results to the school district; or]
  - [(B) A school district may adopt alternative requirements, in consultation with the parent or legal guardian of a homeschooled student, that a student must meet to participate in interscholastic activities, including but not limited to a requirement that a student submit a portfolio of work samples to a school district committee for review to determine whether a student is eligible to participate in interscholastic activities.]

**NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [italic and bracketed] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

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- [(c) Any public school student who chooses to be homeschooled must also meet the minimum standards as described in paragraph (b) of this subsection. The student may participate while awaiting examination results.]
- [(d) Any public school student who has been unable to maintain academic eligibility shall be ineligible to participate in interscholastic activities as a homeschooled student for the duration of the school year in which the student becomes academically ineligible and for the following year. The student must take the required examinations at the end of the second year and meet the standards described in paragraph (b) of this subsection to become eligible for the third year.]
- [(e) The homeschooled student shall be required to fulfill the same responsibilities and standards of behavior and performance, including related class or practice requirements, of other students participating in the interscholastic activity of the team or squad and shall be required to meet the same standards for acceptance on the team or squad. The homeschooled student must also comply with all public school requirements during the time of participation.]
- [(f) A homeschooled student participating in interscholastic activities must reside within the attendance boundaries of the school for which the student participates.]
  - [(2) As used in this section:]

- [(a) "Board" means the State Board of Education.]
- 18 [(b) "Homeschooled students" are those children taught by private teachers, parents or legal 19 guardians as described in ORS 339.030.]
  - [(c) "Interscholastic activities" includes but is not limited to athletics, music, speech, and other related activities.]
    - (1) As used in this section:
  - (a) "Homeschooled student" means a child who is taught by a private teacher, a parent or a legal guardian, as described in ORS 339.030.
  - (b) "Interscholastic activities" means athletics, music, speech and other similar or related activities.
  - (2) A school district may not deny a homeschooled student or a student who attends a public charter school the opportunity to participate in any interscholastic activity if the following conditions are met:
    - (a) The student must meet all school district eligibility requirements except:
    - (A) The school district's school or class attendance requirements; and
  - (B) The class requirements of the voluntary association that administers interscholastic activities.
    - (b) The student must either:
  - (A) Achieve a minimum score that places the student at or above the 23rd percentile, based on national norms, on an examination from the list the State Board of Education adopts under ORS 339.035. The student must take the examination at the end of each school year, and the student's parent or legal guardian must submit the results to the school district for use in determining eligibility for the following year.
  - (B) Meet alternative requirements that a school district adopts, in consultation with the student's parent or legal guardian, for participation in interscholastic activities, including but not limited to a requirement that the student submit a portfolio of work samples to a school district committee for review to determine whether the student is eligible to participate in interscholastic activities.
    - (c) If the student attends a public charter school, the public charter school must pay on

- the student's behalf to the school district, for each school year in which the student participates in an interscholastic activity, an amount equal to five percent of the per student resident average daily membership for the school district.
- (3) A homeschooled student or a student who attends a public charter school may participate in interscholastic activities while awaiting examination results.
- (4) A homeschooled student, or a student who attends a public charter school, who does not maintain academic eligibility is ineligible to participate in interscholastic activities for the duration of the school year in which the student becomes academically ineligible and for the following year. The student must take the required examinations at the end of the second year and meet the standards described in subsection (2)(b) of this section to become eligible for the third year.
- (5) A homeschooled student or a student who attends a public charter school must fulfill the same responsibilities and standards of behavior and performance, including related class or practice requirements, as other students who participate in the interscholastic activity of the team or squad and must meet the same standards for acceptance on the team or squad. The student must also comply with all public school requirements during the time of participation.
- (6) A homeschooled student who participates in interscholastic activities must reside within the attendance boundaries of the school at which the student participates.
- <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect on its passage.
