SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Effective January 1, 2018, repeals nonurban county minimum wage tier and replaces it with urban minimum wage tier for certain cities, increasing incrementally on annual basis through 2023. Creates separate minimum wage for agricultural workers, increasing annually through 2023. Modifies amounts of current annual increases, to take place on January 1 each year beginning in 2018, and provides for adjustments based on inflation.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to minimum wage; creating new provisions; amending ORS 653.025; and repealing section 2, chapter 12, Oregon Laws 2016.
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> ORS 653.025, as amended by section 1, chapter 12, Oregon Laws 2016, is amended to read:
 - 653.025. (1) Except as provided in subsections (2) and (3) of this section, ORS 652.020 and the rules of the Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries issued under ORS 653.030 and 653.261, for each hour of work time that the employee is gainfully employed, no employer shall employ or agree to employ any employee at wages computed at a rate lower than:
 - (a) For calendar year 2003, \$6.90.
- 12 (b) From January 1, 2004, to June 30, 2016, a rate adjusted for inflation as calculated by the commissioner.
 - (c) From July 1, 2016, to June 30, 2017, \$9.75.
 - (d) From July 1, 2017, to [June 30, 2018, \$10.25] **December 31, 2018, \$10.25**.
- 16 (e) From [July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019, \$10.75] **January 1, 2019, to December 31, 2019,** 17 **\$10.30**.
- 18 (f) From [July 1, 2019, to June 30, 2020, \$11.25] January 1, 2020, to December 31, 2020, 19 \$10.40.
 - (g) From [July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2021, \$12] January 1, 2021, to December 31, 2021, \$10.60.
- 21 (h) From [July 1, 2021, to June 30, 2022, \$12.75] January 1, 2022, to December 31, 2022, \$10.80.
 - (i) From [July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023, \$13.50] January 1, 2023, to December 31, 2023, \$11.

 - (3) If the employer is located within [a nonurban county as described in section 2, chapter 12, Oregon Laws 2016] the city limits of Ashland, Bend, Corvallis, Eugene, Medford or Springfield, except as provided by ORS 652.020 and the rules of the commissioner issued under ORS 653.030 and 653.261, for each hour of work time that the employee is gainfully employed, no employer shall employ or agree to employ any employee at wages computed at a rate lower than:
 - (a) From July 1, 2016, to June 30, 2017, \$9.50.
 - (b) From July 1, 2017, to [June 30, 2018, \$10] **December 31, 2018, \$10**.
- 22 (c) From [July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019, \$10.50] January 1, 2019, to December 31, 2019, 23 \$10.75.
 - (d) From [July 1, 2019, to June 30, 2020, \$11] January 1, 2020, to December 31, 2020, \$11.25.
- 25 (e) From [July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2021, \$11.50] January 1, 2021, to December 31, 2021, 26 \$11.75.
 - (f) From [July 1, 2021, to June 30, 2022, \$12] January 1, 2022, to December 31, 2022, \$12.25.
 - (g) From [July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023, \$12.50] January 1, 2023, to December 31, 2023, \$13.
 - (h) After [June 30, 2023, an employer described in this subsection shall pay an employee no less than \$1 per hour less than the minimum wage determined under subsection (1)(j)] January 1, 2024, a rate adjusted annually for inflation as described in subsection (5) of this section.
 - (4) The commissioner shall adopt rules for determining an employer's location[under subsection (2) of this section].
 - (5)(a) The Oregon minimum wage shall be adjusted for inflation as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection.
 - (b) No later than [April] **September** 30 of each year, beginning in [2023] **2024**, the commissioner shall calculate an adjustment of the wage amount [specified in subsection (1)(j)] in effect under subsections (1) to (3) of this section based upon the increase, if any, from [March] August of the preceding year to [March] August of the year in which the calculation is made in the U.S. City Average Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers for All Items as prepared by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor or its successor.
 - (c) The wage amount as adjusted under this subsection shall be rounded to the nearest five cents.
 - (d) The wage amount as adjusted under this subsection becomes effective as the new Oregon minimum wage amount, replacing the minimum wage amount specified in [subsection (1)(j)] sub-

- sections (1) to (3) of this section, on [July] January 1 of the year following the year in which the calculation is made.
- 3 (6) For the purpose of this section, "employee" does not include an agricultural worker 4 as defined in ORS 315.163.
 - <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) For the purpose of this section, "agricultural worker" has the meaning given that term in ORS 315.163.
 - (2) Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section, for each hour of work time that an agricultural worker is gainfully employed, an employer may not employ or agree to employ the agricultural worker at wages computed at a rate lower than:
 - (a) From January 1, 2018, to December 31, 2018, \$10.25.
 - (b) From January 1, 2019, to December 31, 2019, \$10.75.
 - (c) From January 1, 2020, to December 31, 2020, \$11.25.
 - (d) From January 1, 2021, to December 31, 2021, \$11.75.
 - (e) From January 1, 2022, to December 31, 2022, \$12.25.
- 15 (f) From January 1, 2023, to December 31, 2023, \$13.
 - (g) After January 1, 2024, a rate adjusted annually for inflation as described in ORS 653.025 (5).
 - (3) If the employer is located within the urban growth boundary of a metropolitan service district organized under ORS chapter 268 or within the city limits of Ashland, Bend, Corvallis, Eugene, Medford or Springfield, except as provided by ORS 652.020 and the rules of the commissioner issued under ORS 653.030 and 653.261, for each hour of work time that the agricultural worker is gainfully employed, an employer may not employ or agree to employ the agricultural worker at wages computed at a rate lower than:
 - (a) From January 1, 2018, to December 31, 2018, \$10.75.

- 26 (c) From January 1, 2020, to December 31, 2020, \$12.75.
- 27 (d) From January 1, 2021, to December 31, 2021, \$13.50.
 - (e) From January 1, 2022, to December 31, 2022, \$14.25.
 - (f) From January 1, 2023, to December 31, 2023, \$15.
- 30 (g) After January 1, 2024, a rate adjusted annually for inflation as described in ORS 653.025 (5).
