House Bill 3351

SUMMARY

Directs Teacher Standards and Practices Commission to prepare annual report related to duties, powers and functions of commission.

Revises process for filing complaint with commission.

(d) A summary of activities occurring during the previous year related to educator
preparation programs, including changes made to requirements for approved educator prep aration providers, and the status of each educator preparation program in this state.

(e) A summary of significant changes to rules during the previous year and other efforts
by the commission during the previous year to implement statutes.

(f) A summary of placement of students in educator preparation programs, completion
rates for students in educator preparation programs and recommendations for improving
teacher preparation programs.

(3) The report required by this section must be submitted to the appropriate committees
or interim committees of the Legislative Assembly no later than July 1 of every year.
