SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Directs Oregon Business Development Department to prepare plan and strategies to implement recommendations in audit conducted by Secretary of State. Specifies goals and objectives to be addressed by plan and strategies.

Requires submission of annual report to interim legislative committees no later than September 15 of each year.

Sunsets December 31, 2020.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to the Oregon Business Development Department; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Business Development Department shall prepare a plan and strategies to implement recommendations of the office of the Secretary of State made in the office's audit dated December 2016, "Report Number 2016-34: Business Oregon Can Improve the Evaluation and Transparency of Economic Development Incentives and Loans Programs." The plan and strategies shall address the following:

- (a) Evaluating the results of business incentive and loan programs and enterprise zone property tax exemptions. The department shall develop a plan for evaluating business incentives and awards, setting targets and publicly reporting on program and award outcomes, including but not limited to the number of jobs created and retained, the level of wages paid and returns on investment. The plan shall focus on programs and awards supported by the Strategic Reserve Fund and the Oregon Business Retention and Expansion Program Fund, programs that provide business finance loans and loan guarantees and the statewide availability of enterprise zone property tax exemptions. The plan and strategies shall develop the means and frequency for communicating incentive and loan performance to the public and to policymakers in this state and for recommending improvements to the Legislative Assembly, the Governor and the Oregon Business Development Commission.
- (b) Improving transparency of incentive and loan programs and enterprise zone property tax exemptions. The plan shall develop a reporting strategy that identifies which businesses are receiving incentives and awards, the number of jobs created or maintained, the level of wages generated, the amount of enterprise zone property tax exemptions awarded and the areas of this state that benefit from such tax exemptions. The plan shall include creation of a disclosure mechanism for providing this information to policymakers and the public, and establish a timeline for implementation.
- (c) Improving selection processes for Strategic Reserve Fund awards. The plan shall ensure that risk reviews and assessments are completed before award recipients begin funded

- projects and require the department to incorporate risk reviews into decision-making and evaluation of the return on investment. The plan shall require complete disclosure of identified risks to the Governor for purposes of obtaining the Governor's approval of incentives and loans made from the fund.
- (2) In developing and implementing the plan and strategies required under subsection (1) of this section, the department shall:
- (a) Work with the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Revenue Officer to require a sunset review of all tax expenditures;
- (b) Work with county tax assessors and the Department of Revenue to ensure enterprise zone reports are complete and accurate and to gather and report on job and wage data for long-term rural enterprise zones;
- (c) Work with state agencies and local officials to improve disclosure of recipient-level data for incentive and loan programs, including both cost and outcome information; and
- (d) Work with state agencies and the Legislative Assembly to address disclosure limitations due to confidentiality rules and laws.
- (3) The department shall submit an annual report to the interim legislative committees on economic development and business no later than September 15 of each year. The report must include:
- (a) The status of the plan and strategies developed and implemented by the department as required under subsection (1) of this section; and
- (b) Recommendations for legislative changes that may result in improving and enhancing the department's provision of business incentives and loans, and enterprise zone tax exemptions, in accordance with the goals and objectives set forth in subsection (1) of this section.
 - SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2017 Act is repealed on December 31, 2020.
- SECTION 3. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect on its passage.
