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AN ACT

Relating to the financial administration of the State Parks and Recreation Department; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the State Parks and Recreation Department, for the following purposes:

- (1) Director's office
 \$ 951,156

 (2) Central services
 \$ 15,418,149

 (3) Parks development
 \$ 3,290,749

 (4) Direct services
 \$ 62,063,168
- (5) Community support and grants \$ 14,933,616

SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Parks and Natural Resources Fund to the State Parks and Recreation Department, for the following purposes:

(1)	Director's office	\$ 913,881
(2)	Central services	\$ 14,580,460
(3)	Parks development	\$ 19,450,322
(4)	Direct services	\$ 49,782,668
(5)	Community support grants	\$ 15,598,301
(6)	Central services debt service	\$ 834,165

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$2,213,444 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the State Parks and Recreation Department for the payment of debt service.

SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from federal funds collected or received by the State Parks and Recreation Department for the following purposes:

(1) Parks development...... \$ 1,742,574

- (2) Direct services...... \$ 2,123,199
- (3) Community support and grants \$ 12,532,075

SECTION 5. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect July 1, 2017.
