## **House Concurrent Resolution 16**

Sponsored by Representative GOMBERG (at the request of Oregon Humane Society) (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Designates rescued shelter dogs as official state dog.

1	CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	Whereas every year Oregon animal shelters take in tens of thousands of homeless dogs; and
3	Whereas an army of dedicated shelter staff, volunteers, animal behaviorists and veterinarians
4	work hard to ready these dogs for a second chance at finding their permanent home; and
5	Whereas Oregonians open their hearts and adopt over 18,000 rescued shelter dogs every year
6	and
7	Whereas shelter dogs, like Oregonians, are renowned for their resilience, endurance and ability
8	to overcome adversity; and
9	Whereas both many shelter dogs and Oregonians have come through unimaginable hardship but
10	look to the future with hope and strength; and
11	Whereas in the diversity of shelter dogs, which are of every shape and size and from every
12	background, Oregonians see a reflection of themselves; and
13	Whereas because shelter dogs embody all breeds, as Oregon's state dog they would represent
14	the choice of all dog lovers in this state; and
15	Whereas like Oregonians, shelter dogs are eager to leave their indoor confines and join their
16	friends in the freedom, beauty and adventure of Oregon's great outdoors; and
17	Whereas Oregon is the land of the second chance, something every shelter dog deserves; and
18	Whereas shelter dogs remind us that second chances are worth it; and
19	Whereas Oregonians know that adopting a shelter dog rescues two lives at once; and
20	Whereas shelter dogs and Oregonians are optimists, knowing that a bright future waits ahead
21	now, therefore,
22	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
23	That we, the members of the Seventy-ninth Legislative Assembly, acknowledge Oregon's con-
24	nection to shelter dogs and designate rescued shelter dogs as the official dog of the State of Oregon
