2	Whereas John Shilts began his career with the State of Oregon at the State Accident Insurance
3	Fund Corporation (SAIF), where he served for 13 years in progressively responsible leadership po-
4	sitions, including three years as the director of SAIF's risk management services; and
5	Whereas in 1997, John Shilts accepted a position with the Workers' Compensation Division of
6	the Department of Consumer and Business Services and managed the division's Benefits and Policy
7	Services Section; and
8	Whereas highly respected in his department, John Shilts was promoted to administrator of the
9	Workers' Compensation Division in May 2000; and
10	Whereas John Shilts was instrumental in developing what is considered one of the best workers'
11	compensation programs in the country; and
12	Whereas at the Capitol, John Shilts' testimony before legislative committees frequently provided
13	information vital to the completion of legislation; and
14	Whereas a true public servant, John Shilts rejected lucrative offers from the private sector be-
15	cause his passion and commitment was to serve the people of Oregon; and
16	Whereas John Shilts retired from the Department of Consumer and Business Services in De-
17	cember 2015; and
18	Whereas John Shilts served Oregon well and helped to ensure that Oregonians who were injured
19	on the job received the services they needed; now, therefore,
20	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
21	That we, the members of the Seventy-ninth Legislative Assembly, honor and thank John Shilts
22	for the many years of fine and dedicated public service he performed for the benefit of injured
23	workers throughout this state.
