## **House Joint Resolution 33**

Sponsored by Representative NEARMAN

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to amplify types of legislative measures that require three-fifths majority vote in each house for passage. Refers proposed amendment to people for their approval or rejection at next regular general election.

1	JOINT RESOLUTION
<b>2</b>	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
3	PARAGRAPH 1. Section 25, Article IV of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, is amended
4	to read:
5	Sec. 25. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) of this section, a majority of all the
6	members elected to each House shall be necessary to pass every bill or Joint resolution.
7	(2) Three-fifths of all members elected to each House shall be necessary to pass [bills]:
8	(a) Bills for raising revenue;
9	(b) Bills that establish new or increased taxes, including but not limited to increases in
10	tax rates or the elimination or reduction of tax credits, exemptions, exclusions, deductions,
11	subtractions or other tax expenditures;
12	(c) Bills that modify or expand a tax base so as to produce revenue;
13	(d) Bills that establish new or increased fees or fines; or
14	(e) Bills, any portion of which is described in paragraphs (a) to (d) of this subsection, that
15	also contain offsetting reductions in revenue.
16	(3) All bills, and Joint resolutions passed, shall be signed by the presiding officers of the re-
17	spective houses.

19	PARAGRAPH 2. The amendment proposed by this resolution shall be submitted to the
20	people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election held throughout
21	this state.
