Senate Bill 112

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Requires carbon monoxide alarm in enclosed structure that has carbon monoxide source and is occupied and used as food service facility or for-profit business. Provides that requirement does not apply to residential structures.

- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2017 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 455.
- SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section:
- 6 (a) "Carbon monoxide alarm" means a device that:
- 7 (A) Detects carbon monoxide;
- 8 (B) Produces a distinctive audible alert when carbon monoxide is detected;
 - (C) Conforms to State Fire Marshal rules;
- 10 **(D)** Is listed by Underwriters Laboratories or any other nationally recognized testing laboratory or an equivalent organization; and
 - (E) Operates as a distinct unit or as two or more single station units wired to operate in conjunction with each other.
 - (b) "Carbon monoxide source" means:
 - (A) A heater, fireplace, appliance or cooking source that uses coal, kerosene, petroleum products, wood or other fuels that emit carbon monoxide as a by-product of combustion; or
 - (B) An attached garage with an opening that communicates directly with a space having characteristics described in subsection (2)(a) or (b) of this section.
 - (2) A carbon monoxide alarm is required in an enclosed structure that has a carbon monoxide source and:
 - (a) Is licensed under ORS chapter 624 and identified under the structural specialty code as having a use and occupancy classification in Group A-2; or
 - (b) Is used in the operation of one or more for-profit businesses and is not identified in the structural specialty code as having a use and occupancy classification in Group R.
 - (3) A carbon monoxide alarm required by this section must be installed in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions and any applicable requirements of the state building code.
 - SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2017 Act applies to enclosed structures that are constructed, reconstructed, altered or repaired on or after the effective date of this 2017 Act.
