## Senate Bill 116

Sponsored by Senator RILEY (at the request of Dale Brummett) (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Requires State Forester to make any recreational opportunities in state forests free for disabled veterans and persons on leave from military active duty on certain holidays. Requires State Forester to enter into agreement with State Parks and Recreation Department to issue interagency veterans and military special access pass for recreation in state parks and state forests.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to military special access programs.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
  - SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2017 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 530.
  - SECTION 2. If, under ORS 530.050, the State Forester permits the use of lands acquired pursuant to ORS 530.010 to 530.040 for recreation, the State Forester shall:
  - (1) Authorize the recreational use of the lands without charge, upon the showing of proper identification, by either a disabled veteran or a person on leave from military active duty status on Memorial Day, Independence Day or Veterans Day; and
  - (2) Enter into a memorandum of understanding, or other agreement deemed appropriate, with the State Parks and Recreation Department that provides for the State Parks and Recreation Department to issue an interagency veterans and military special access pass in accordance with this section and ORS 390.124.
