79th OREGON LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY--2017 Regular Session

Senate Bill 146

Sponsored by Senators COURTNEY, WINTERS; Senator GIROD (at the request of Oregon State Capitol Foundation) (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Designates third Saturday in March of each year as Cherry Blossom Day. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to an annual day of observance; and declaring an emergency.

3 Whereas the cherry tree is an essential part of Salem's history, culture and economy; and

4 Whereas Salem's first Cherry Festival was held in 1903 with a three-day celebration that in-

5 cluded a queen's coronation and many other activities, as well as industrial displays and exhibits

6 of cherries arranged in booths along Court Street; and

7 Whereas in 1907 the Pacific Coast Association of Nurserymen adopted a resolution declaring

8 Salem to have the "greatest and finest display of cherries known in history" and by unanimous vote

9 gave Salem the title "Cherry City"; and

Whereas in 1913 the Cherrians organization was established in Salem to host an annual Blossom
Day; and

12 Whereas in 1986 the City of Salem and Kawagoe City, Japan, entered into a sister city re-13 lationship to strengthen the bonds between them; and

Whereas the cherry blossom has been a symbol of Japanese culture since time immemorial and is symbolic of the Cherry City as well; and

16 Whereas in 1992 more than 150 Akebono flowering cherry trees were planted on the Capitol 17 Mall in keeping with Salem's renowned affinity for cherries; and

18 Whereas residents and visitors alike enjoy strolling beneath the blossoms, and the significance 19 of the cherry tree in Salem has had a long and fruitful history; now, therefore,

20 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

21 <u>SECTION 1.</u> The Legislative Assembly designates the third Saturday in March of each 22 year as Cherry Blossom Day in Salem and encourages all residents and visitors to join in this 23 observance.

24 <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 25 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect 26 on its passage.
