SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Authorizes Department of Corrections to establish program for selling inmate handicrafts. Removes requirement that handicrafts be sold at department institutions.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to Department of Corrections inmate handicrafts; amending ORS 421.142.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 421.142 is amended to read:
 - 421.142. (1) [The superintendent of the Department of Corrections institution hereby is vested with authority, in the discretion of the superintendent,] The Department of Corrections may establish a program to allow the manufacture of small articles of handiwork by the inmates of [the] Department of Corrections [institution] institutions, out of raw materials purchased by the inmates with their own funds, which articles may be sold to the public [at the Department of Corrections institution]. State-owned property [shall] may not be sold or given to inmates under this section.
 - (2) The [superintendent of the Department of Corrections institution in which the inmate manufacturing the article is confined] **department** may provide that all or a part of the sales price of the articles be deposited to the account of the inmate manufacturing the article.
