SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Requires Secretary of State to designate statistical sampling technique to identify percentage of active electors not legally entitled to vote.

Requires Secretary of State to conduct sampling at least one time per year and to post summary of results of sampling on Secretary of State's website.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to review of active electors.
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2017 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 247.
 - SECTION 2. (1) The Secretary of State by rule shall designate a statistical sampling technique to identify the percentage of active electors who are not legally entitled to vote.
 - (2) At least one time per calendar year, the Secretary of State shall use the technique developed as described in subsection (1) of this section to conduct a statistical sampling of the eligibility of all active electors.
 - (3) At the conclusion of each statistical sampling, the Secretary of State shall post a summary of the results of the sampling on the Secretary of State's website. This summary must include:
 - (a) A description of the statistical sampling technique used;
 - (b) The number of active electors identified as being ineligible to vote;
 - (c) The percentage of active electors identified as being ineligible to vote; and
