

## HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO RESOLVE CONFLICTS TO A-ENGROSSED SENATE BILL 20

1 On page 17 of the printed A-engrossed bill, delete lines 23 through 45.

2 On page 18, delete lines 1 through 18 and insert:

3 “**SECTION 15.** ORS 807.066, as amended by section 30, chapter 66, Oregon Laws 2017 (Enrolled  
4 House Bill 2314), is amended to read:

5 “807.066. (1) Subject to subsection (2) of this section, the Department of Transportation may not  
6 issue driving privileges to a person who is under 18 years of age unless:

7 “(a) The person has graduated from high school and provides the department with proof of  
8 graduation satisfactory to the department;

9 “(b) The person has received a certificate for passing an approved high school equivalency test,  
10 such as the General Educational Development (GED) test, from a community college and provides  
11 the department with proof of the certificate satisfactory to the department; or

12 “(c) The person’s parent or legal guardian certifies that the person is:

13 “(A) Enrolled in a school of this state, or any other state or any other country;

14 “(B) Enrolled in a community college and making satisfactory progress toward a certificate for  
15 passing an approved high school equivalency test, such as the General Educational Development  
16 (GED) test, [or] a high school diploma **or a modified diploma**;

17 “(C) Being taught by a private teacher, legal guardian or parent in compliance with ORS  
18 339.035;

19 “(D) Exempted from school attendance requirements due to circumstances beyond the control  
20 of the person; or

21 “(E) Exempt under ORS 339.030 (2) from the requirement to attend school.

22 “(2) The department may not issue driving privileges to a person who is under 18 years of age  
23 and whose driving privileges are suspended under ORS 809.423 (3) for withdrawing from school un-  
24 less the person:

25 “(a) Has graduated from high school and provides the department with proof of graduation sat-  
26 isfactory to the department;

27 “(b) Has received a certificate for passing an approved high school equivalency test, such as the  
28 General Educational Development (GED) test, from a community college and provides the depart-  
29 ment with proof of the certificate satisfactory to the department;

30 “(c) Provides the department with a form provided by the department and signed by the princi-  
31 pal, or the designee of the principal, of the school attended by the person that declares that the  
32 person is enrolled in a school of this state, or any other state or any other country;

33 “(d) Provides the department with a form provided by the department and signed by the au-  
34 thorized representative of the community college attended by the person that declares that the  
35 person is making satisfactory progress toward a certificate for passing an approved high school

1 equivalency test such as the General Educational Development (GED) test;

2 “(e) Provides the department with a form provided by the department and signed by the au-

3 thorized representative of the community college attended by the person that declares that the

4 person is making satisfactory progress toward a high school diploma **or a modified diploma**;

5 “(f) Provides the department with a form provided by the department and signed by the author-

6 ized representative of the education service district or school district having jurisdiction over the

7 area of the person’s residence that declares that the person is being taught by a private teacher,

8 legal guardian or parent in compliance with ORS 339.035;

9 “(g) Provides the department with documentation satisfactory to the department that indicates

10 that the person is exempted from school attendance requirements due to circumstances beyond the

11 control of the person; or

12 “(h) Provides the department with documentation satisfactory to the department that the person

13 is exempt under ORS 339.030 (2) from the requirement to attend school.”
