SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 206

1	On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 30 and delete page 2 and insert:
2	"SECTION 2. (1) The board of a community college may authorize receipt of compen-
3	sation for any faculty member from private or public resources, including, but not limited
4	to, income from:
5	"(a) Consulting;
6	"(b) Appearances and speeches;
7	"(c) Intellectual property conceived, reduced to practice or originated and therefore
8	owned within the community college;
9	"(d) Providing services or other valuable consideration for a private corporation, indi-
10	vidual or entity, whether paid in cash or in-kind, stock or other equity interest or anything
11	of value regardless of whether there is a licensing agreement between the community college
12	and the private entity; and
13	"(e) Performing public duties paid by private organizations, including institution corpo-
14	rate affiliates, that augments a faculty member's publicly funded salary. Such income shall
15	be authorized and received in accordance with policies and standards established by each
16	board.
17	"(2) Each board may not authorize compensation, as described in subsection (1) of this
18	section, that, in the board's judgment, does not comport with the mission of the community
19	college or that substantially interferes with a faculty member's duties to the community
20	college.
21	"(3) Any compensation described and authorized under subsection (1) of this section is
22	considered official compensation or reimbursement of expenses for purposes of ORS 244.040
23	and is not considered an honorarium prohibited by ORS 244.042. If authorization or receipt
24	of the compensation creates a potential conflict of interest, the faculty member shall report
25	the potential conflict in writing in accordance with standards of the board. The disclosure is
26	a public record subject to public inspection.
27	"(4) Each board shall adopt standards governing faculty outside employment and activ-
28	ities, including potential conflicts of interest, as defined by standards of the board and con-
29	sistent with ORS 244.020, and the public disclosure thereof, and procedures for reporting and
30	hearing potential or actual conflict of interest complaints.".

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
