SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Establishes Task Force on the Every Student Succeeds Act. Sunsets task force on December 31, 2017. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to the Every Student Succeeds Act; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on the Every Student Succeeds Act is established.
 - (2) The task force consists of seven members appointed as follows:
 - (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two members from among members of the Senate, neither of whom may be from the same political party.
 - (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two members from among members of the House of Representatives, neither of whom may be from the same political party.
 - (c) The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall appoint three members.
 - (3) The task force shall:

- (a) Review the Every Student Succeeds Act and state education law; and
- (b) Recommend any legislation necessary to ensure that state law complies with the Every Student Succeeds Act.
- (4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
- (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members of the task force.
 - (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.
- (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.
- (8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task force.
 - (9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.
- (10) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to education no later than September 15, 2017.
 - (11) The Department of Education shall provide staff support to the task force.
- (12) Notwithstanding ORS 171.072, members of the task force who are members of the

Legislative Assembly are not entitled to mileage expenses or a per diem and serve as volu
teers on the task force. Other members of the task force are not entitled to compensation
or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.

- (13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of the task force's duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.
 - SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2017 Act is repealed on December 31, 2017.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect on its passage.
