Senate Bill 223

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Requires in-home caregivers employed by or contracting with in-home care agencies to meet training requirements for home care workers established by Home Care Commission.

3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 443.340 is amended to read:
5	443.340. The Oregon Health Authority shall adopt [administrative] rules necessary for the im-
6	plementation and administration of ORS 443.305 to 443.350. [These] The rules shall include, but are
7	not limited to, [a requirement] requirements that:
8	(1) An in-home care agency [must] conduct criminal background checks on all individuals em-
9	ployed by or contracting with the agency as in-home caregivers; and
10	(2) All individuals employed by or contracting with an in-home care agency as in-home
11	caregivers meet the training requirements established for home care workers by the Home
12	Care Commission under ORS 410.604.
13	SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 443.340 by section 1 of this 2017 Act apply to in-
14	home caregivers employed by in-home care agencies on or after the effective date of this 2017
15	Act and in-home caregivers entering into contracts with in-home care agencies on or after
16	the effective date of this 2017 Act.
