## Senate Bill 250

Sponsored by Senator TAYLOR, Representative HUFFMAN (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Creates affirmative defense to crime of prostitution if, at time of alleged offense, defendant was victim of certain trafficking crimes.

4	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
5	SECTION 1. ORS 167.007 is amended to read:
6	167.007. (1) A person commits the crime of prostitution if the person engages in, or offers or
7	agrees to engage in, sexual conduct or sexual contact in return for a fee.
8	(2) Prostitution is a Class A misdemeanor.
9	(3) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this section that the defendant, at
10	the time of the alleged offense, was a victim of the crime of trafficking in persons as de-
11	scribed in ORS 163.266 (1)(b) or (c).
12	SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 167.007 by section 1 of this 2017 Act apply to
13	prostitution offenses alleged to have been committed on or after the effective date of this
14	2017 Act.
