## Senate Bill 282

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires State Parks and Recreation Department to conduct study on fines related to convictions of criminal mischief for activities occurring in state parks. Directs department to report on study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before September 15, 2018.

Sunsets January 2, 2019.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to fines for criminal mischief in state parks.
  - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
    - SECTION 1. (1) The State Parks and Recreation Department, in consultation with the Oregon State Police and other relevant state agencies, shall conduct a study on the appropriateness of fines applicable to a conviction for the crime of criminal mischief for activities occurring in a state park.
    - (2) The department shall submit a report with the results of the study, and may include recommendations for legislation, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary in the manner provided under ORS 192.245 on or before September 15, 2018.
- SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2017 Act is repealed on January 2, 2019.
