SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 3

1	On page 1 of printed bill, line 2, after "provisions;" delete the rest of the line and delete lines
2	3 and 4 and insert "and repealing ORS 468B.052 and sections 2, 3, 4, 12 and 13, chapter 783, Oregon
3	Laws 2013.".
4	Delete lines 6 through 20 and delete pages 2 through 10 and insert:
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6	"REPEAL OF MORATORIUM ON MINING USING MOTORIZED EQUIPMENT
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8	" <u>SECTION 1.</u> Sections 2, 3 and 4, chapter 783, Oregon Laws 2013, are repealed.
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10	"PROHIBITION ON CERTAIN PLACER MINING OPERATIONS
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12	"SECTION 2. Sections 3 to 6 of this 2017 Act are added to and made a part of ORS
13	chapter 468B.
14	"SECTION 3. As used in sections 3 to 6 of this 2017 Act:
15	"(1) 'Essential indigenous anadromous salmonid habitat' has the meaning given that term
16	in ORS 196.810, as further defined and designated by rule by the Department of State Lands
17	pursuant to ORS 196.810.
18	"(2) 'Line of ordinary high water' has the meaning given that term in ORS 274.005.
19	"(3) 'Motorized in-stream placer mining' means mining using any form of motorized
20	equipment, including but not limited to the use of a motorized suction dredge, for the pur-
21	pose of extracting gold, silver or any other precious metals from placer deposits of the beds
22	or banks of the waters of the state.
23	"(4) 'Operator' means any person that is engaged in motorized in-stream placer mining
24	operations.
25	"SECTION 4. (1) An operator may not allow a discharge to waters of the state from a
26	motorized in-stream placer mining operation or activity without having an individual permit
27	or being covered by a general permit issued under ORS 468B.050.
28	"(2) In order to protect indigenous anadromous salmonids and habitat essential to the
29	recovery and conservation of Pacific lamprey, motorized in-stream placer mining may not
30	be permitted to occur up to the line of ordinary high water in any river in this state con-
31	taining essential indigenous anadromous salmonid habitat, from the lowest extent of essen-
32	tial indigenous anadromous salmonid habitat to the highest extent of essential indigenous
33	anadromous salmonid habitat.
34	"(3) The prohibition in subsection (2) of this section does not apply to the use of non-
35	motorized mining technology, including but not limited to gravity dredges and syphon

1 dredges.

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2 "<u>SECTION 5.</u> (1) An application for a permit under ORS 468B.050 to engage in motorized 3 in-stream placer mining must include:

"(a) The name and address of the operator;

5 "(b) Information on how the proposed motorized in-stream placer mining location will be 6 accessed by the operator;

"(c) A written affirmation furnished by the operator stating that the operator has reviewed information that is available as part of an application process and that is related to
cultural resource preservation and best management practices for motorized in-stream
placer mining;

"(d) The geographic coordinates for the proposed motorized in-stream placer mining operation; and

13 "(e) Any other information required to be included in the application.

14 "(2) In addition to any other condition imposed by the permit, motorized in-stream placer 15 mining pursuant to a permit issued under ORS 468B.050 may not:

"(a) Involve the operation of motorized equipment between the hours of the earlier of 8
p.m. or sunset and 8 a.m. within 1,000 feet of a residence or a campground;

18 "(b) Involve the operation of a motorized suction dredge having a suction hose with an 19 inside diameter exceeding four inches; or

"(c) To the extent feasible and as may be further specified in the permit, involve the operation of motorized equipment in a manner deleterious to freshwater mollusks, essential indigenous anadromous salmonid habitat or habitat essential to the recovery and conservation of Pacific lamprey.

"(3) The condition under subsection (2)(a) of this section may be waived in a permit or 24 permit coverage issued to the owner of a federal mining claim, but only to the extent that 25 26 the permit or permit coverage applicant demonstrates that the exercise of the prohibition 27will violate federal law or constitute a regulatory taking requiring compensation under the United States Constitution or the Oregon Constitution. An applicant seeking a waiver must 28 29 provide substantial evidence specific to the mining claim in question that establishes the potential violation or regulatory taking. The Department of Environmental Quality shall re-30 view and make a determination regarding the request for a waiver as part of the permit or 3132permit coverage decision.

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"FEES

"<u>SECTION 6.</u> A person shall pay the following fees to the Department of Environmental
 Quality for a general permit issued under ORS 468B.050 for motorized in-stream placer min ing, unless the Environmental Quality Commission establishes a lower fee amount under
 ORS 468.065:

40"(1) A fee of \$250 for the initial application for or renewal of permit coverage; and41"(2) An annual fee of \$250.

45 "SECTION 7. Section 8 of this 2017 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 468.922 to

2	"SECTION 8. (1) A person commits the offense of unlawful motorized in-stream placer
3	mining if the person knowingly engages in motorized in-stream placer mining, as defined in
4	section 3 of this 2017 Act, without a permit issued under ORS 468B.050 or in violation of any
5	rule, permit, order or any applicable requirement adopted or issued under ORS 468B.050 or
6	sections 3 to 6 of this 2017 Act.
7	"(2) Subject to ORS 153.022, unlawful motorized in-stream placer mining is a Class A vi-
8	olation.
9	"(3) Notwithstanding ORS 153.042, an enforcement officer, as defined in ORS 153.005, may
10	issue a citation under subsection (1) of this section when the conduct alleged to constitute
11	a violation has not taken place in the presence of the enforcement officer, if the enforcement
12	officer has reasonable grounds to believe that the conduct constitutes a violation on the ba-
13	sis of information received from an employee of the Department of Environmental Quality.
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15	"SUCTION DREDGE STUDY FUND AND FEES
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17	"SECTION 9. ORS 468B.052 and sections 12 and 13, chapter 783, Oregon Laws 2013, are
18	repealed.
19	"SECTION 10. Any moneys remaining in the Suction Dredge Study Fund established by
20	section 13, chapter 783, Oregon Laws 2013, on the effective date of this 2017 Act that are
21	unexpended, unobligated and not subject to any conditions shall be transferred by the State
22	Treasurer to the credit of an account of the Department of Environmental Quality to be used
23	in the same manner as fees collected for permits issued under ORS 468B.050.
