Senate Bill 318

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Directs Department of Education to provide technical assistance and support to school districts and community colleges to prevent and respond to interpersonal violence.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2	Relating to addressing interpersonal violence in education settings.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Education shall provide technical assistance and

support to school districts and community colleges to prevent and respond to interpersonal violence, including sexual assault and other forms of abuse.

- (2) The technical assistance and support provided to school districts must include:
- (a) Best practices and resources related to the prevention of and responses to:
- 9 (A) Teen dating violence and domestic violence, as provided by ORS 339.366 and 339.368;
 - (B) Abuse and sexual conduct, as provided by ORS 339.370 to 339.400; and
 - (C) Acts of harassment, intimidation or bullying or acts of cyberbullying, as provided by ORS 339.351 to 339.364.
 - (b) Coursework related to:
- 14 (A) A child sexual abuse prevention instructional program, as required under ORS 15 336.059; and
 - (B) Human sexuality education, as required under ORS 336.455.
 - (3) The technical assistance and support provided to community colleges must include:
 - (a) Legal assistance regarding federal mandates related to interpersonal violence; and
- 19 **(b) Best practices and resources related to:**
 - (A) Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972;
 - (B) The Clery Act, 20 U.S.C. 1092 (f), as amended;
- 22 (C) Sexual assault protocols, as required under ORS 350.255;
- 23 (D) Confidentiality of victim communications and records, as provided by ORS 147.600; 24 and
- 25 (E) Privacy of student health records, as required under section 1, chapter 20, Oregon 26 Laws 2016.

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
